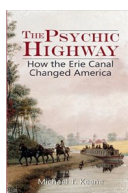

Saturday, March 26 from 1-3 in the downstairs meeting room.

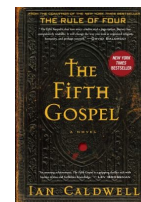
