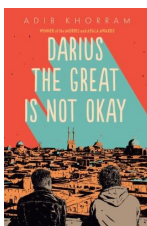

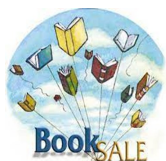

Dear Nearsighted Nellie:

We do! We have a large collection of Fiction and Non-Fiction large print books in the adult section of the library. There are also large print editions in Children's and Teen sections. They circulate for the same amount of time as regular books and they can be renewed once.
