Time, it seems, is the only proof of "success", but we of the class of '53 believe that times will prove that we have reached our goal.





The Future Farmers of U-E have had an active year. They have two members who are officers in the County Association. Joe Kotek is vice president and Gale Bennett is the county reporter.



The '52 team will go down in U-E football history as the first "Ty" Cobb team to discard the iron man theory and adopt the newer ideas of specialized football. It will also be known as one of the hardest-fighting and scrappiest teams that the old Alma Mater has ever produced.

Picked to be guardians not of stellar but of cellar positions, the team surprised coaches and authorities alike and completed the season in a tie with Binghamton North for second place. To some observers, and to all U-E fans, the squad was the uncrowned champion of the Southern-Tier Conference.

Losing only to Ithaca in the season's second game, U-E bounced back to sweep the last six games, which, combined with an opening-game tie with North, gave an over-all 6-1-1 record.

Outscoring its opponents 185-31, "the tigers" proceeded in the following manner: U-E 6-North 6; Champion Ithaca 12-U-E 7 (tasting wildcat meat for the first time in four years); U-E 14-Johnson City 7; (avenging a humiliating first meeting, 0-0); U-E 33-Vestal 0; U-E 7-Utica Proctor 6 (whew!); U-E 66-Elmira South Side 0 (wow!); U-E 19-Last Year's Champs, Elmira Free Academy 0; and finally, in the Turkey Day classic, U-E 33-Binghamton Central 7.

"Ty" Harold Cobb and Captain Al Paparella won "coach" and "player of the year" awards. In addition, Kevin Conwicke, Al Yankovich and Don Parke were placed on the "All S. T. Conference" team.

"The Tiger" has once again risen, roaring. Beyond a doubt this has been a great team, with an excellent coach, a group of top ballplayers, and, most of all, a great fighting heart.

















To bring us peace—guard freedom's light.


