The Orange Tornado of U-E proclaimed again by many sports authorities as "the team to beat for the conference title," unfortunately did not come up to these early predicted expectations. But the '54 team will be remembered as one of the heaviest teams in conference history. With a line averaging about two hundred pounds per man, the team proved to be one of the most feared throughout the Conference. U-E soon became known as a powerful team, consisting of a massive line and a very speedy and shifty backfield.

Although U-E had quarterbacking problems during the season, "Ty" Cobb made a skillful rearrangement of the backfield; and the team progressed in a satisfactory manner, completing the season with a record of five wins and three losses.

George Matola, Tony Ciaravino, and Ralph Weiland, under the guidance of Peter Sylvester, made gain after gain against opposing teams; and it was gains such as these that enabled U-E to capture third place in the Southern Tier Conference.










