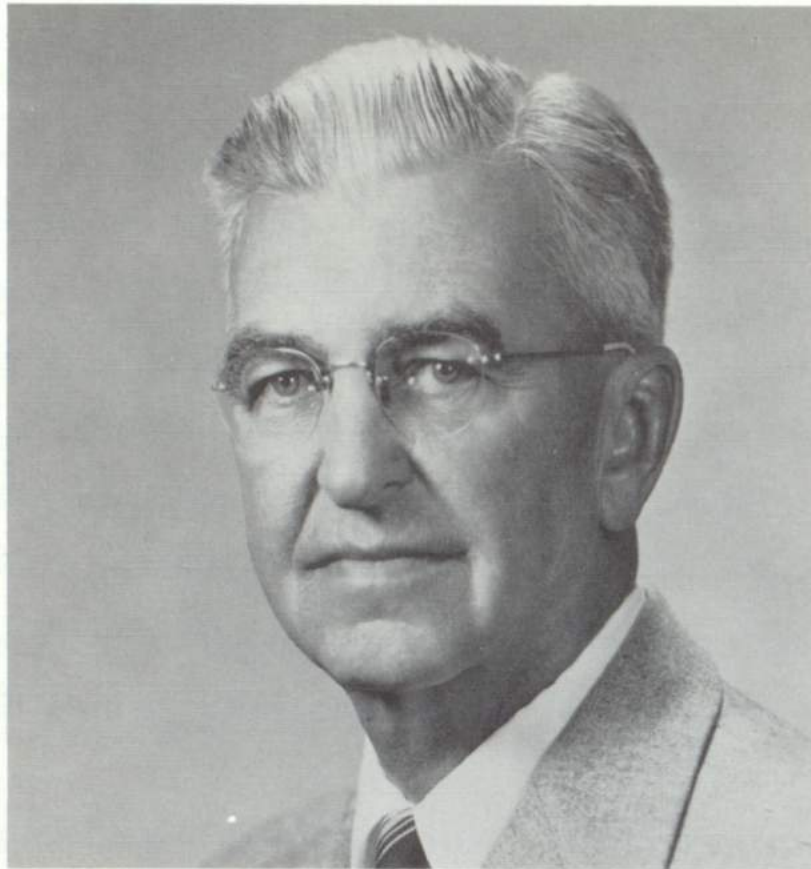

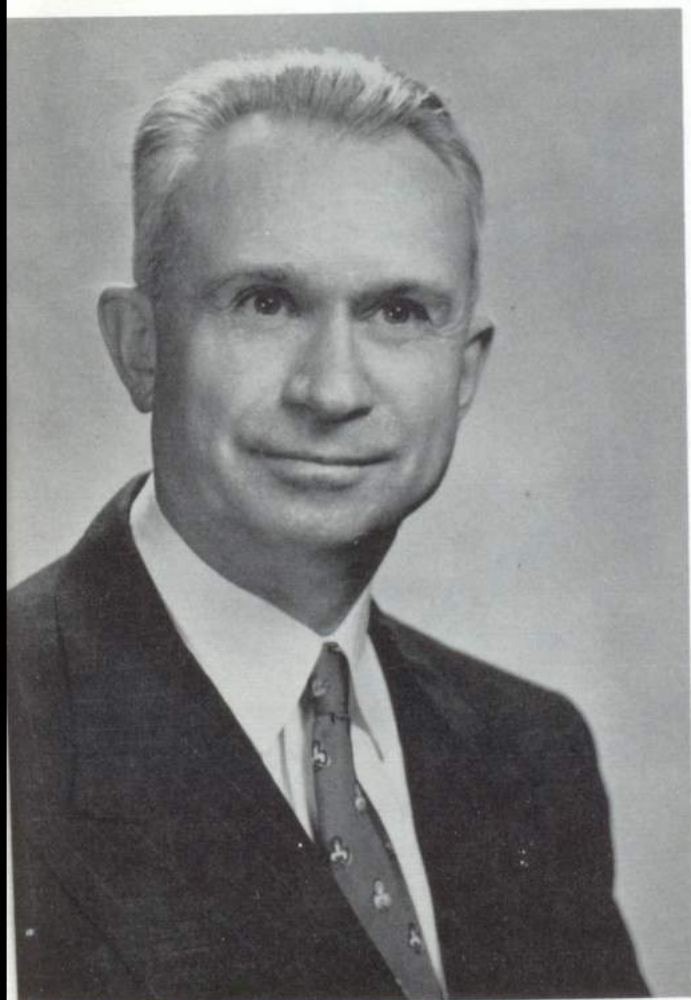
When you make a cake, using the best or the most costly ingredients does not guarantee a perfect result; the cook is the determining factor.

The sophomore class, taking a minute from the tedious studies of the year, might well say, "So far so good. Just wait until next year, we'll be even better."

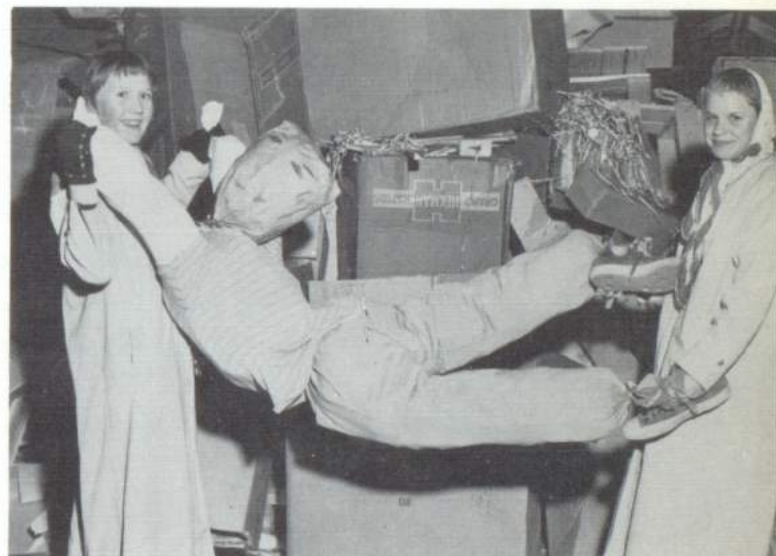

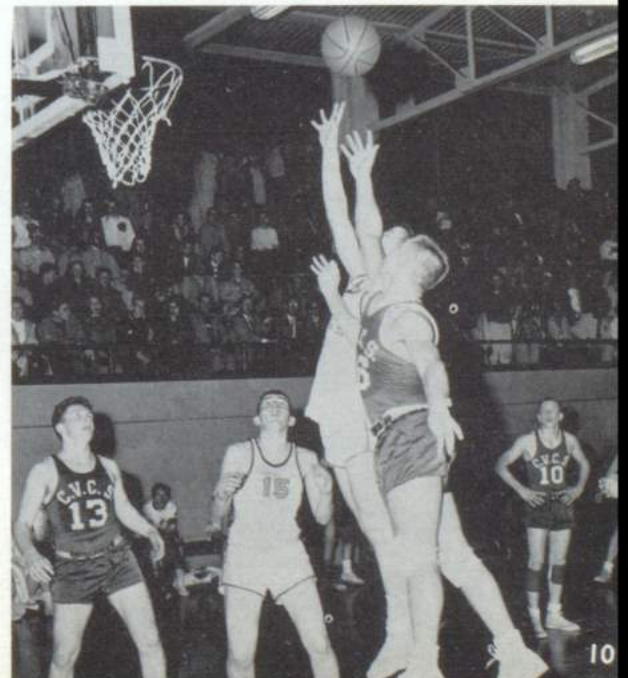

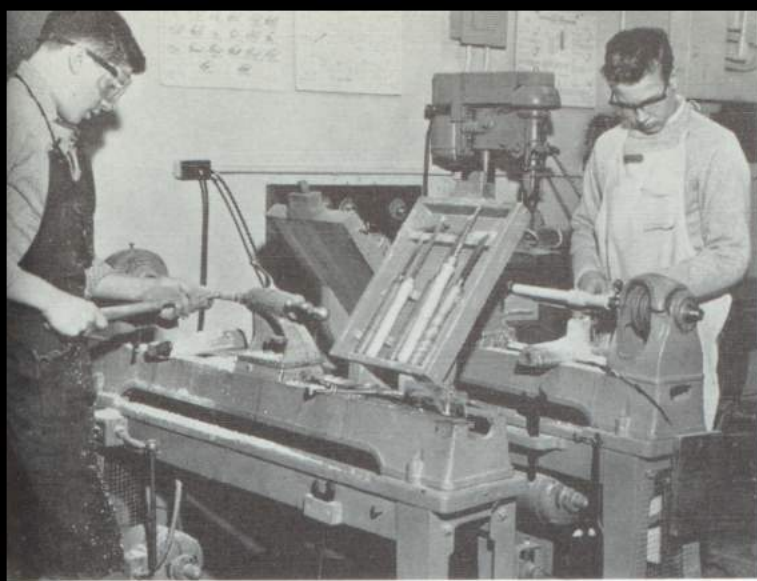
