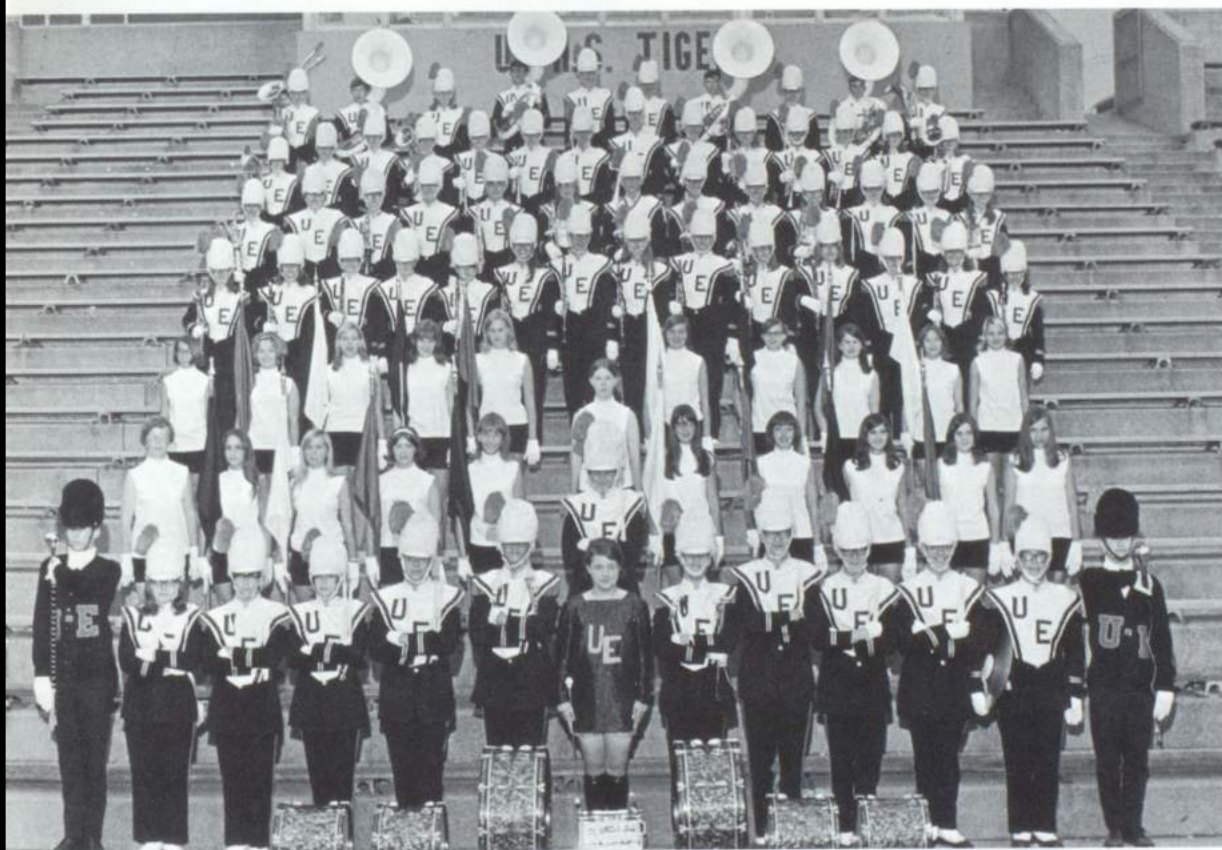

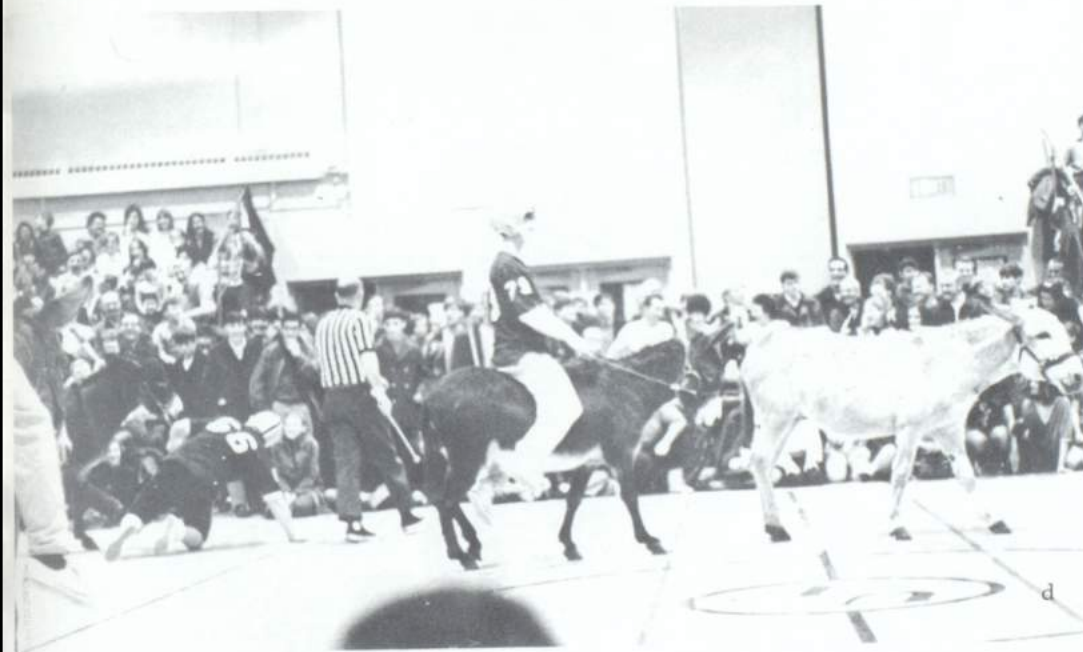

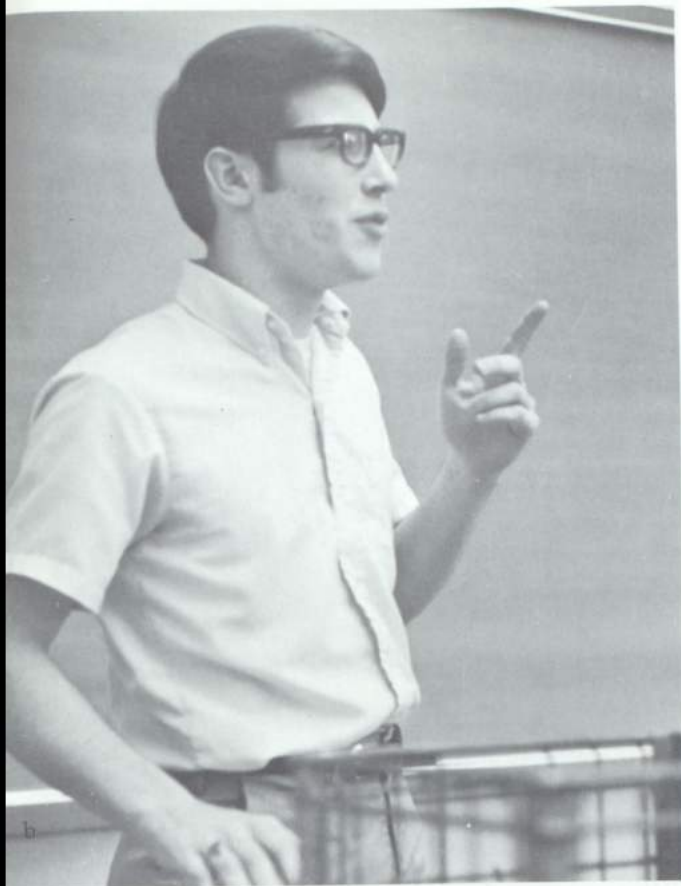


Key Club raised money for the Greg Latla Memorial Scholarship.

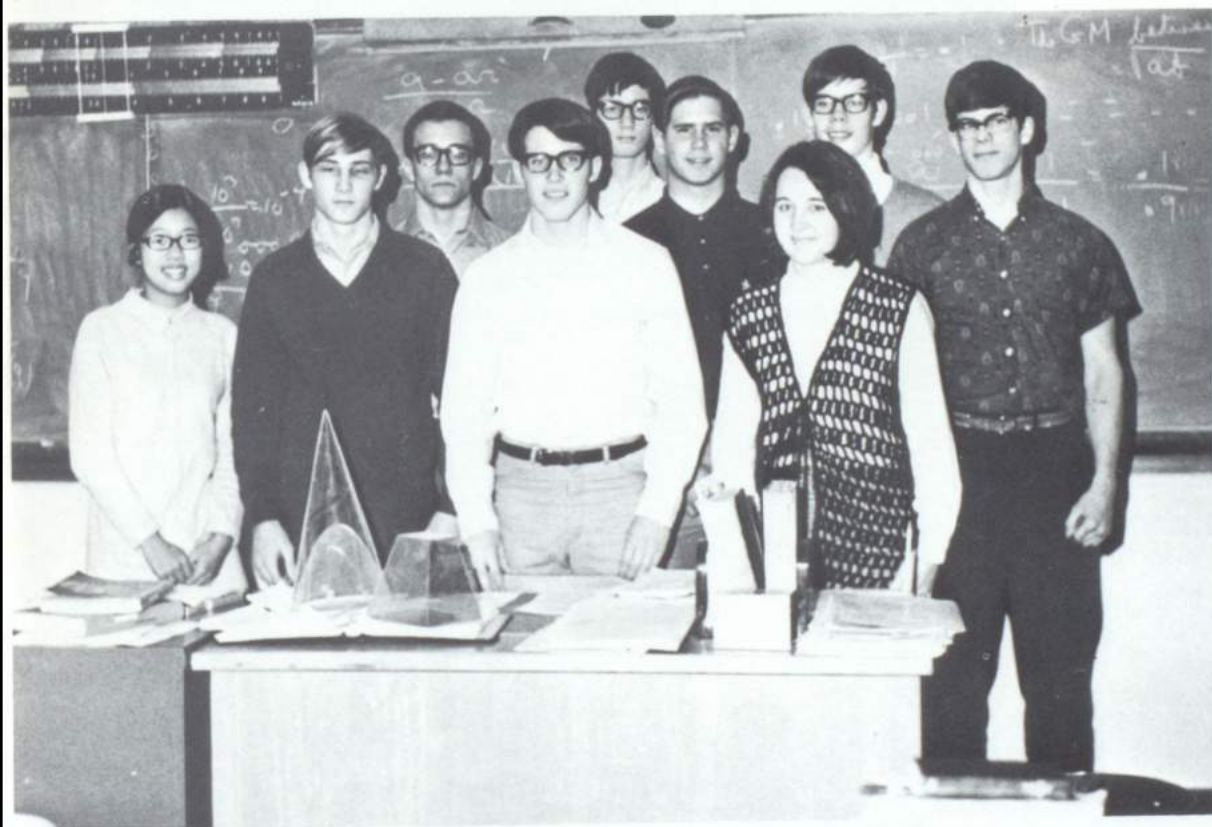

Co-ops received Regents credit & work experience.

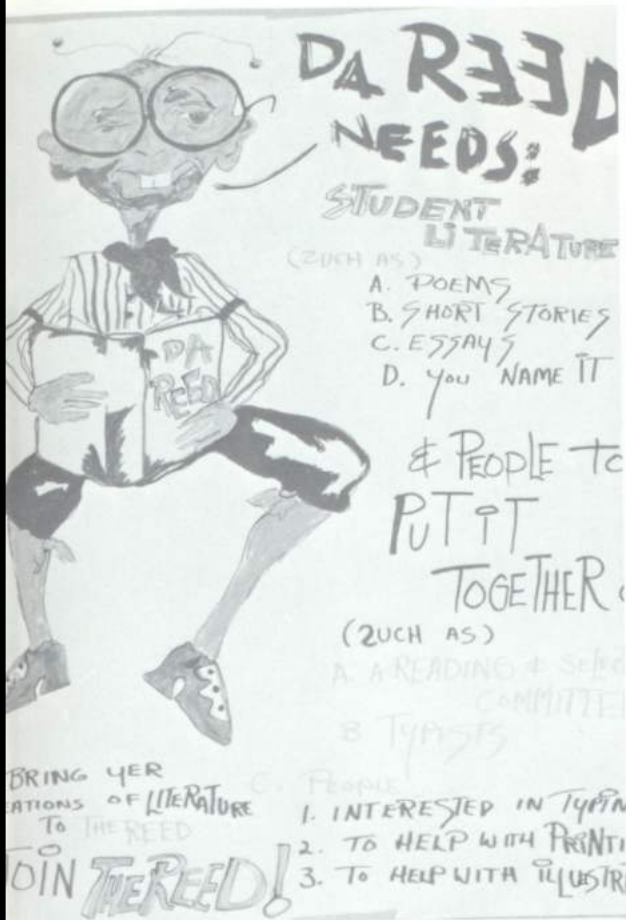
The Co-operative Office Skills Program provided a chance for business students to receive Regents credit for actual work experience related to the vocational course in which they were enrolled.

The faculty advisor was Mr. Clayton, and Miss Coccetti and Mr. Merriam served as chaperones.

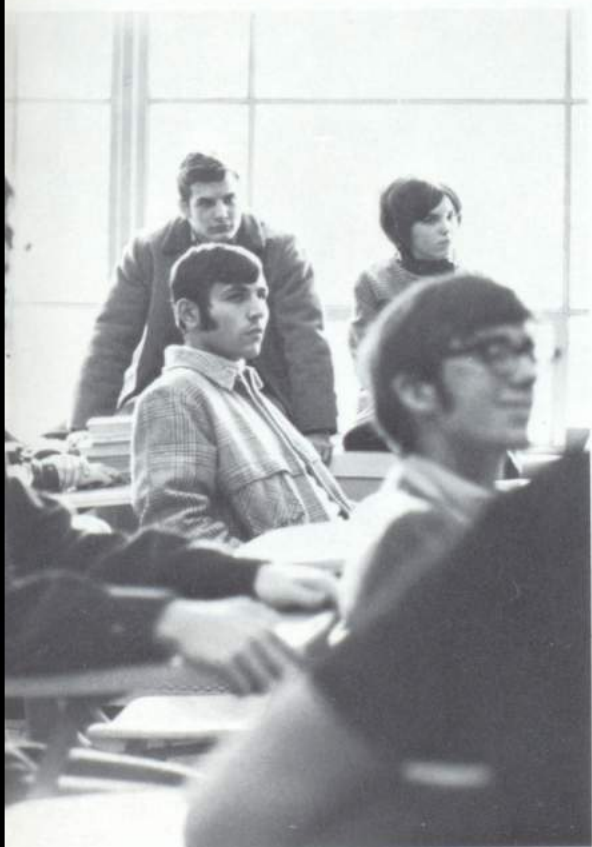


History Club stimulated students' interest in the past.

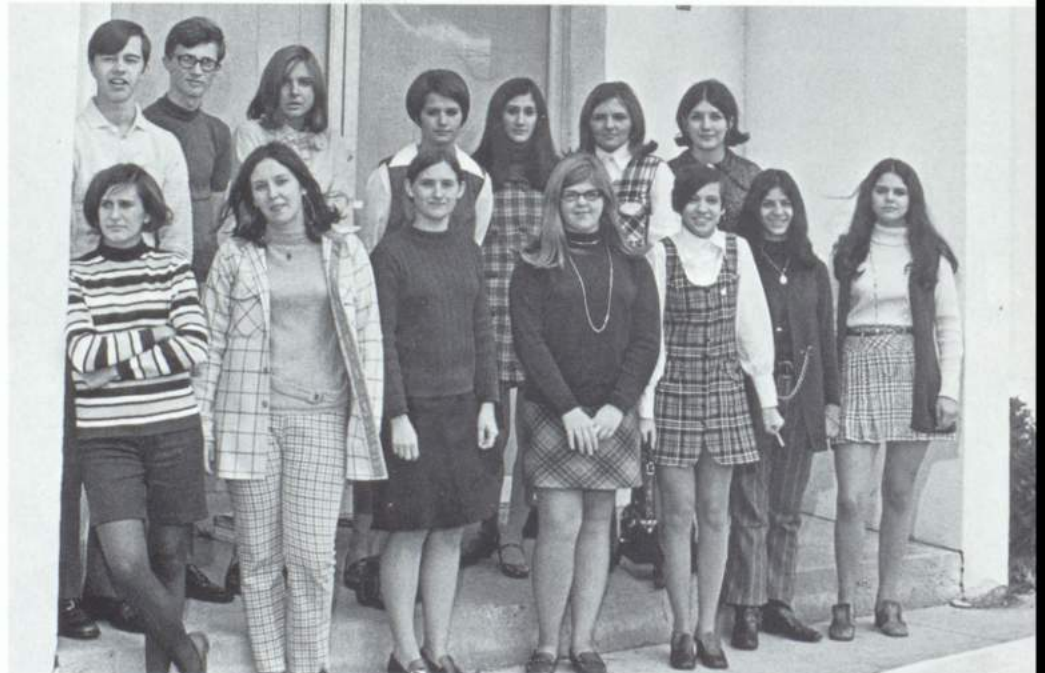

N.H.S. members were outstanding students at U-E.

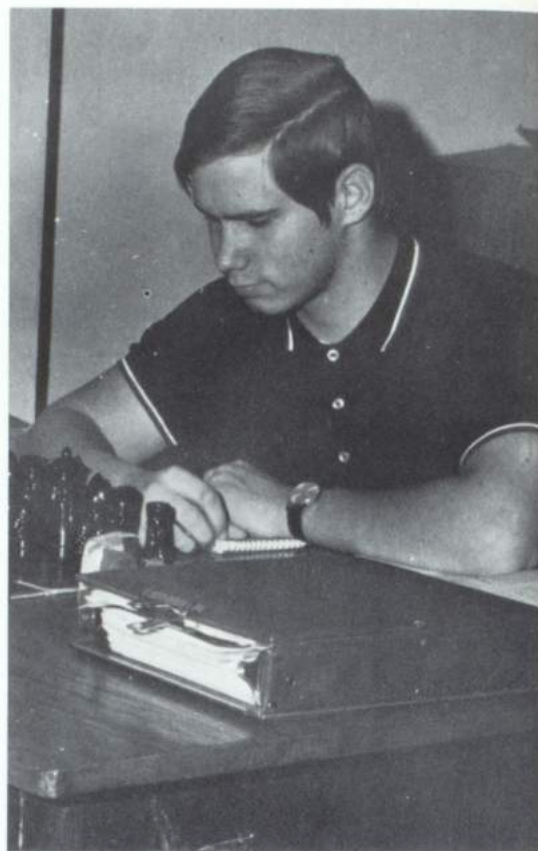

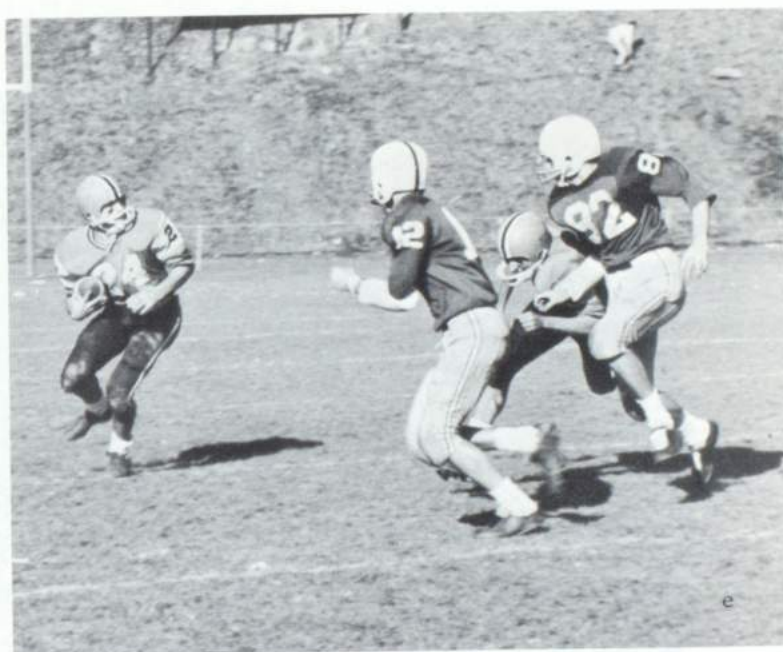

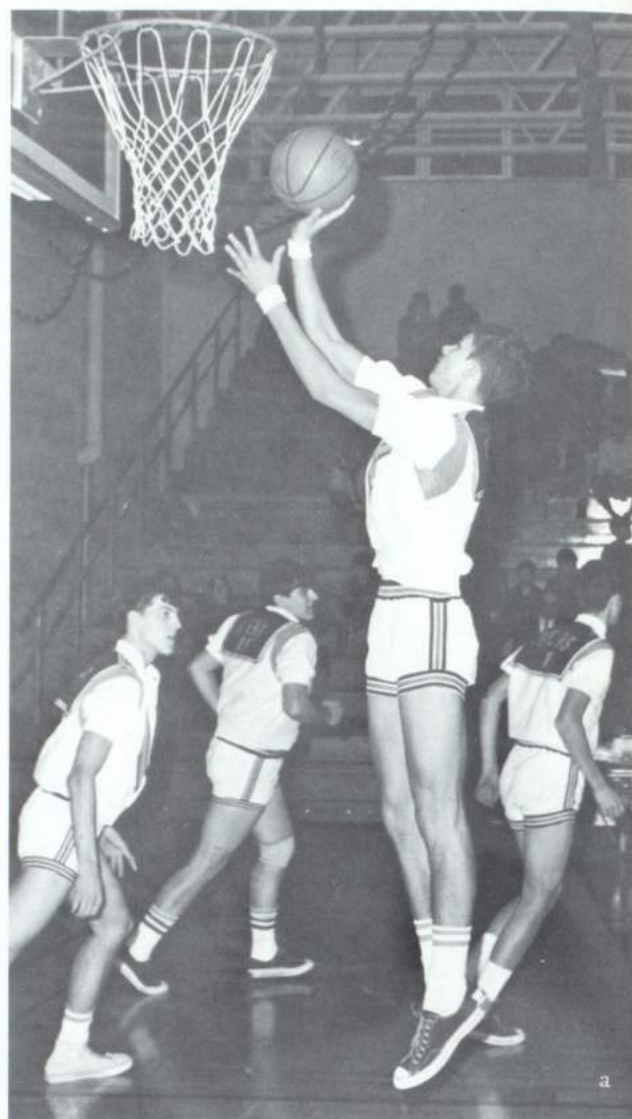

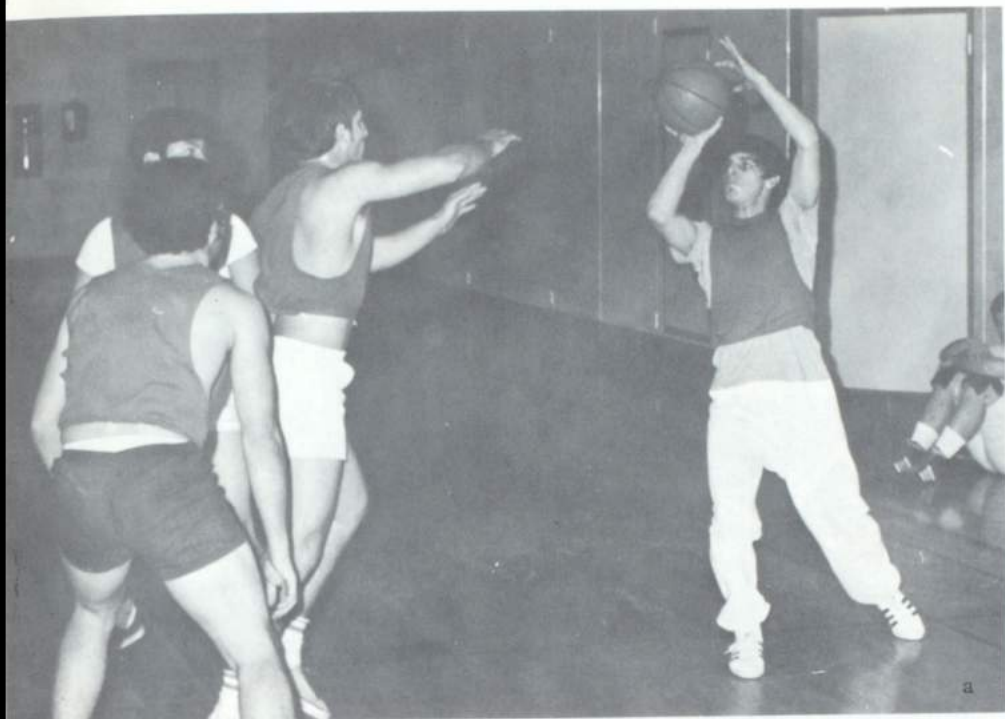

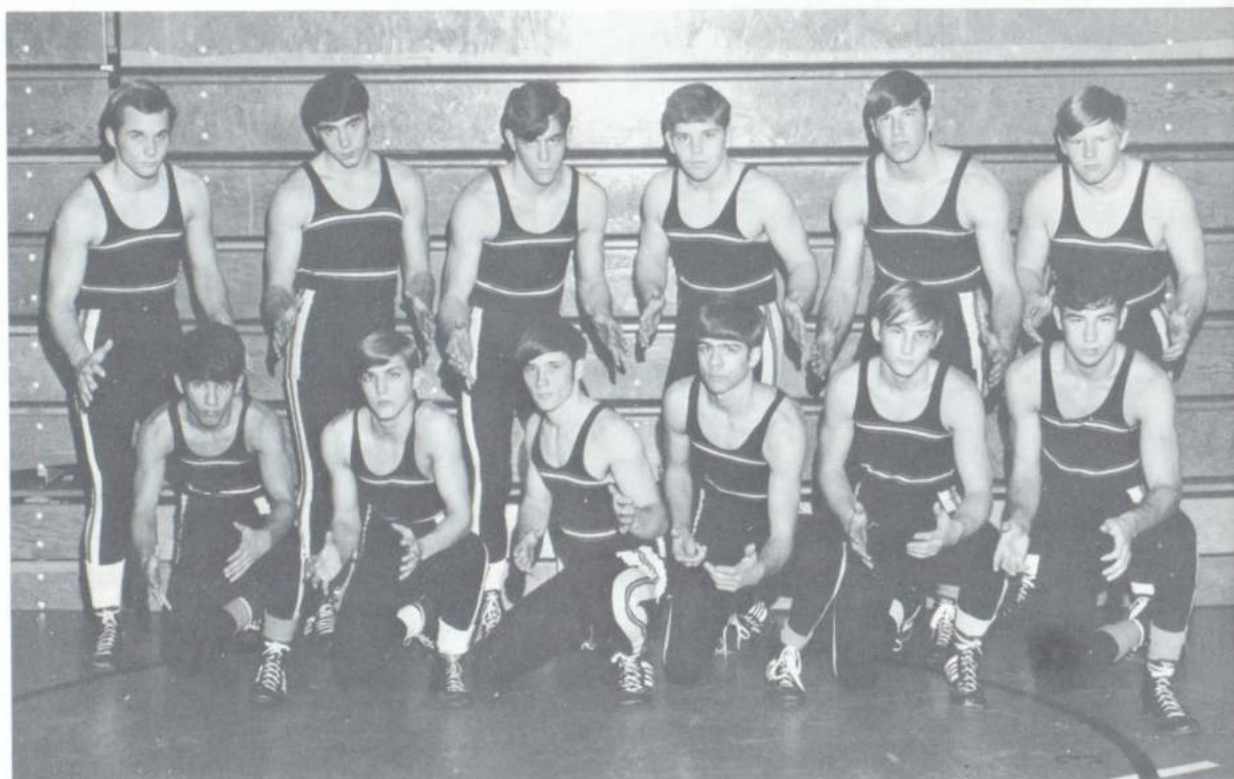
