English Department

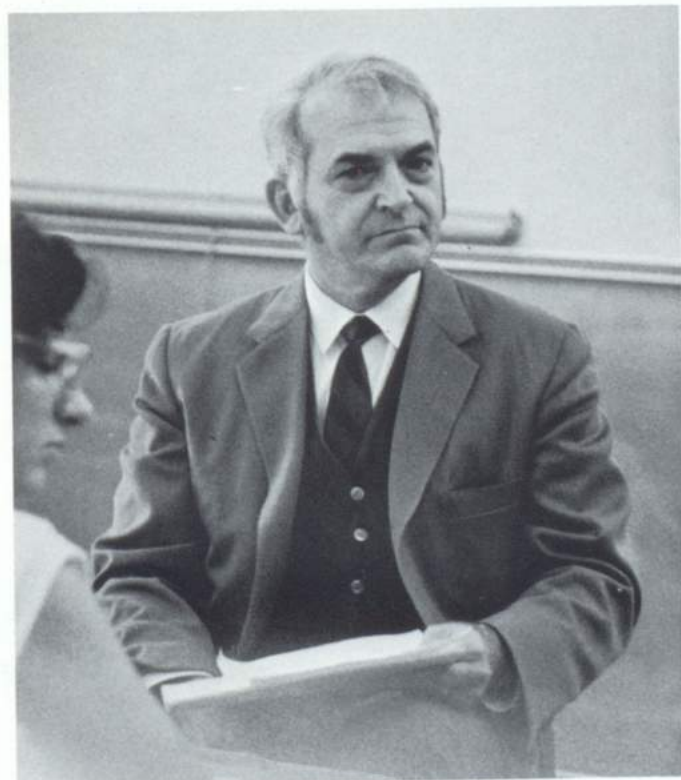
Course choices offered in Senior English.

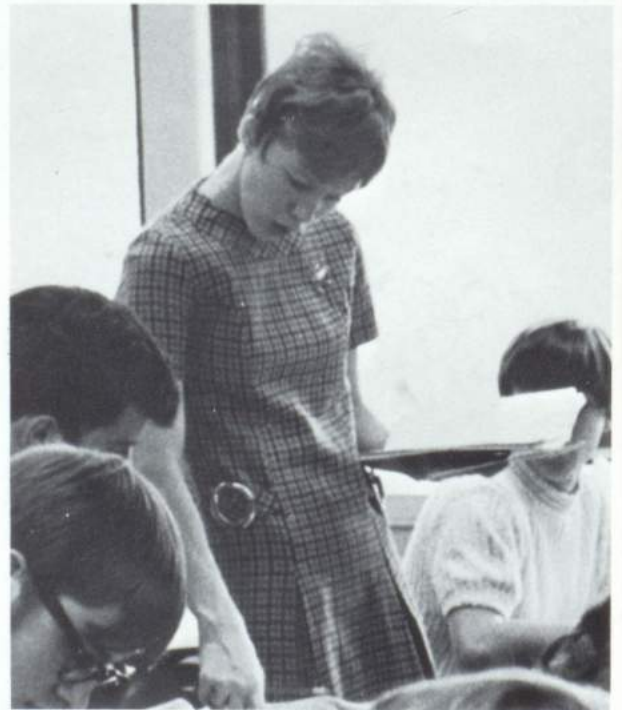
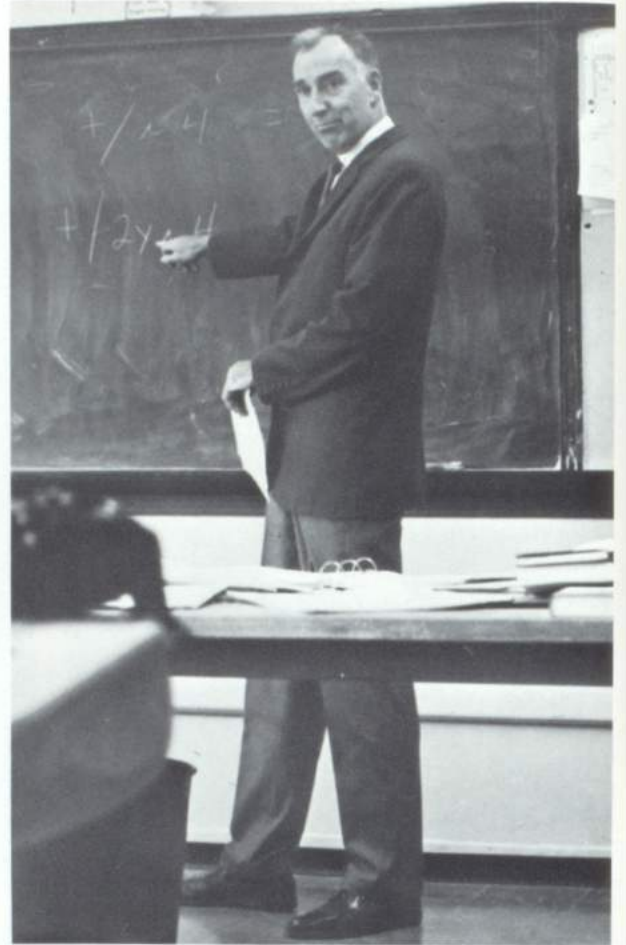


Math Department

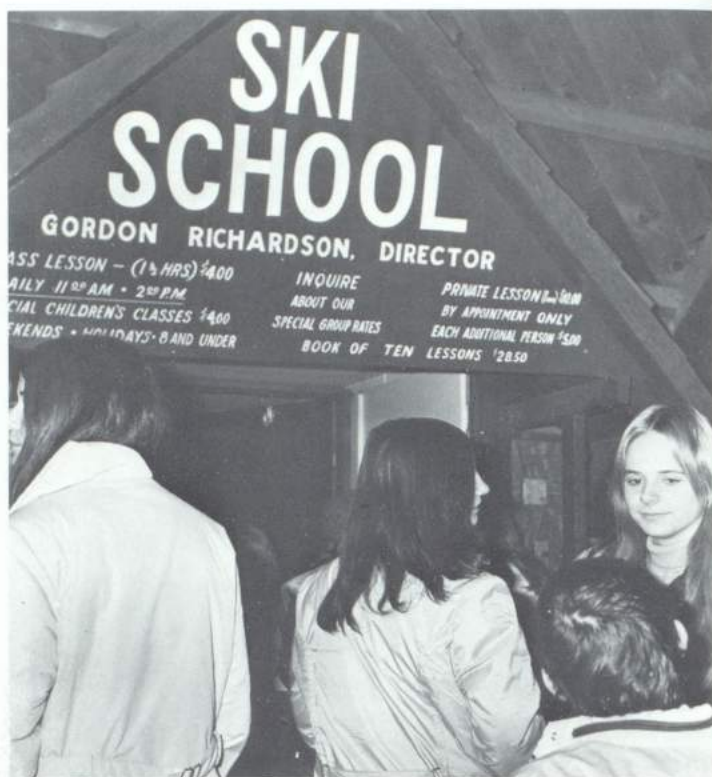
N.Y.C. trip was promised to History Club.

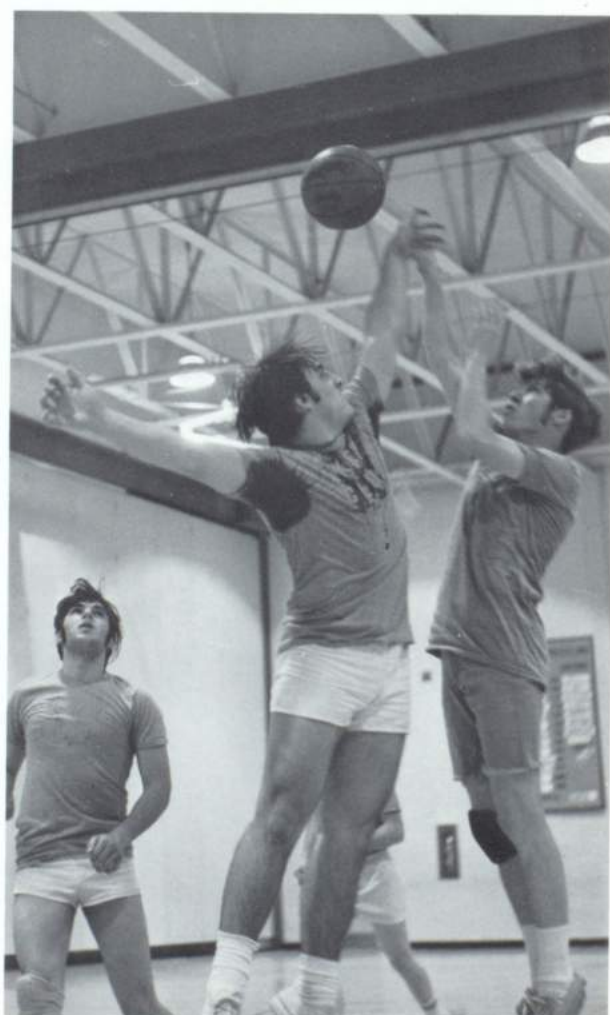
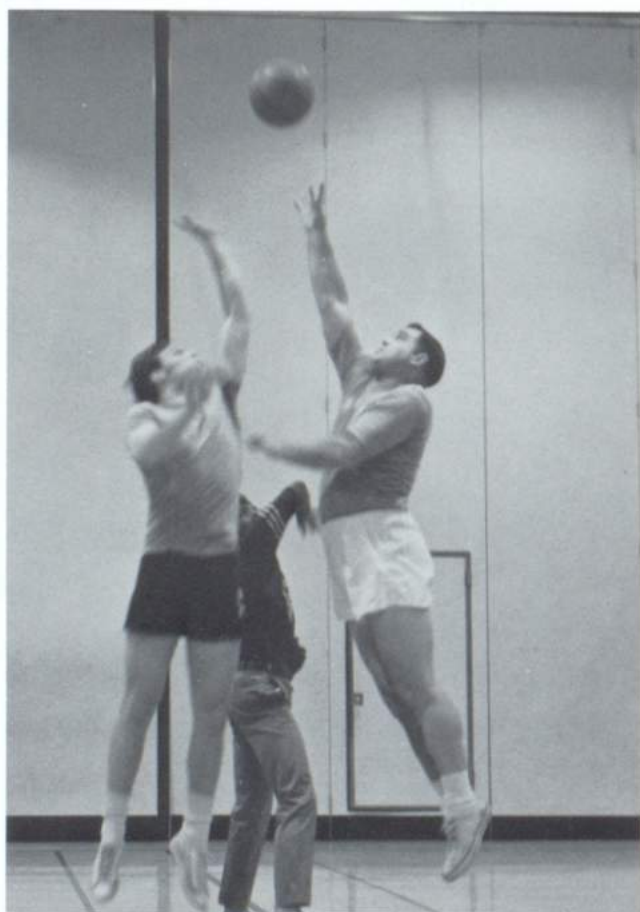

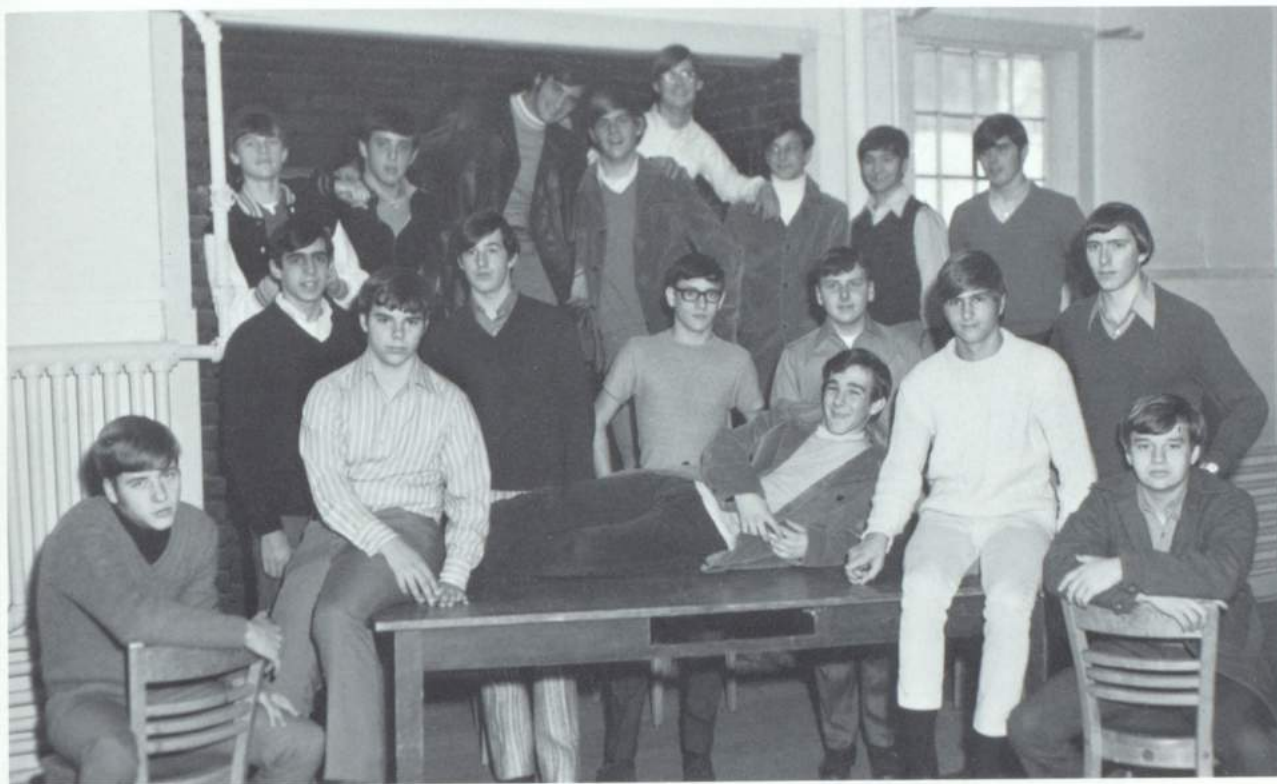
The "Faculty Bombers" survived yet another Key Club onslaught.

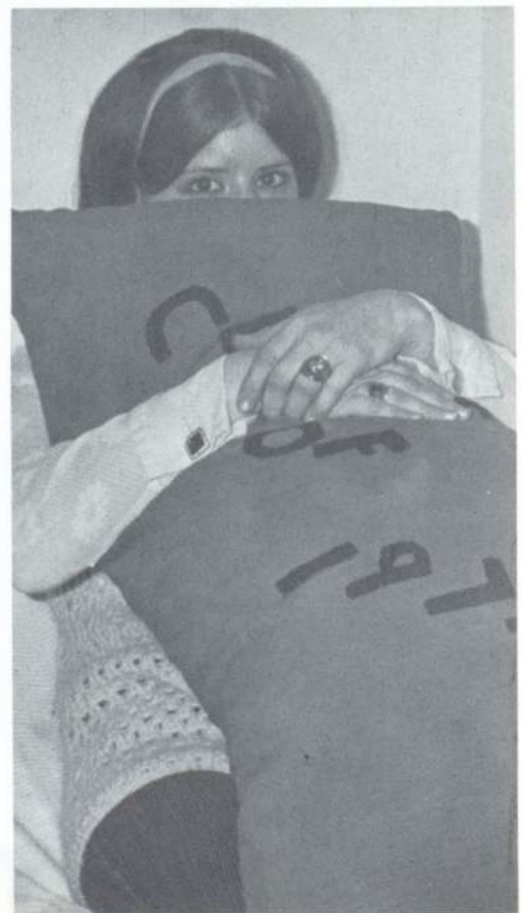

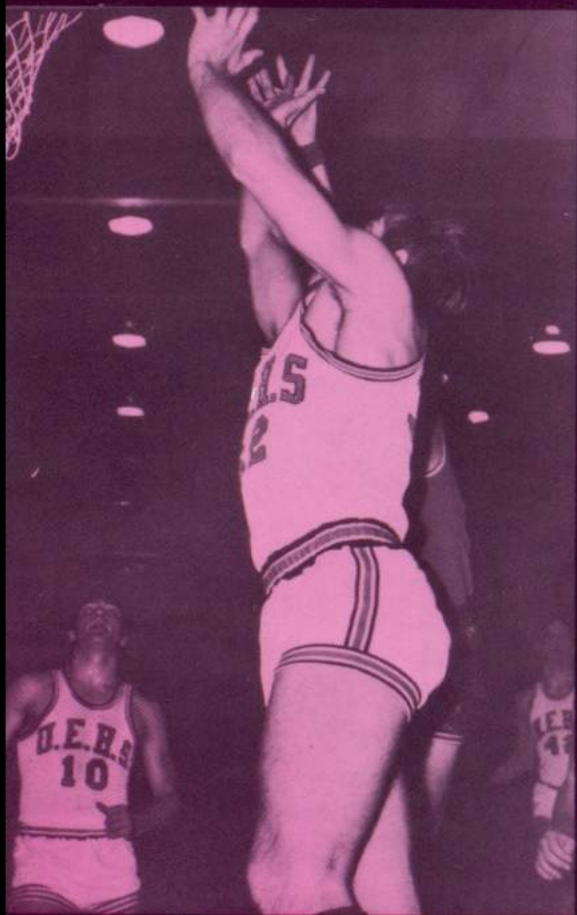
