Election '76: Carter rides a donkey to victory.

President Jimmy Carter's long, once solitary journey from Plains, Georgia carried him to the White House in January with a victory forged from the traditional Democratic Party coalition of the Old South and industrial North.

Carter was declared the victor over President Gerald Ford early November 3, when his electoral vote total reached 272, two more than the 270 needed for election. Wisconsin and Mississippi were the states that established the Democratic candidate's majority in the Associated Press tabulation.

The closeness of the vote raised questions about absentee ballots, which were handled differently in each State.

Some States said absentee ballots had already been counted, or would have no effect; some said absentee ballots are accepted only up until the hour the polls close and are counted with other votes on election night; some said they don't count absentee votes until the day after.



Smile for us Jimmy . . .

Returning to Plains from his election headquarters in Atlanta, Carter received a tumultuous, emotional welcome from a crowd that included most of the town's 638 residents. He said he was looking forward to "an enjoyable next 4 years."

Beaming his now-famous smile, Carter told the crowd, "I told you I didn't intend to lose."

The latest returns showed Carter carrying 22 states and the District of Columbia, while Ford had 26.

Gerald Ford asked the blessings of God and the Nation for Jimmy Carter, surrounded by his proud and shaken family, a big man in a blue suit swallowing defeat. The Fords faced the formal concession fighting back tears, and mostly succeeding.

When they walked into the room, losers for the first time in their lives, all the noise died. The President, his voice reduced to a croak from 11 days of non-stop campaigning, stepped up to the podium and announced he had conceded the cliff-hanger presidential election and had told Carter so by phone call and telegram.

Ford knew it was over by the time he went to bed at 3:15 a.m. So he slept a bit late, got up at 9 a.m., had breakfast, got his raw throat doctored and bowed out as the 38th President of the United States. With his chin up.

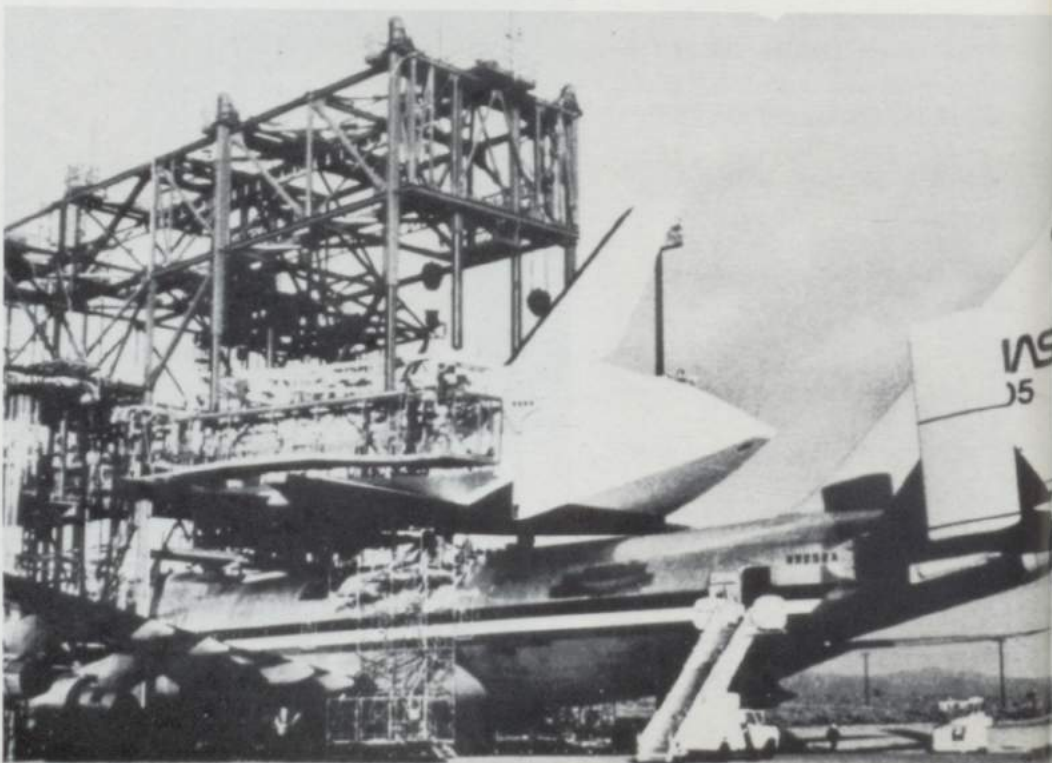

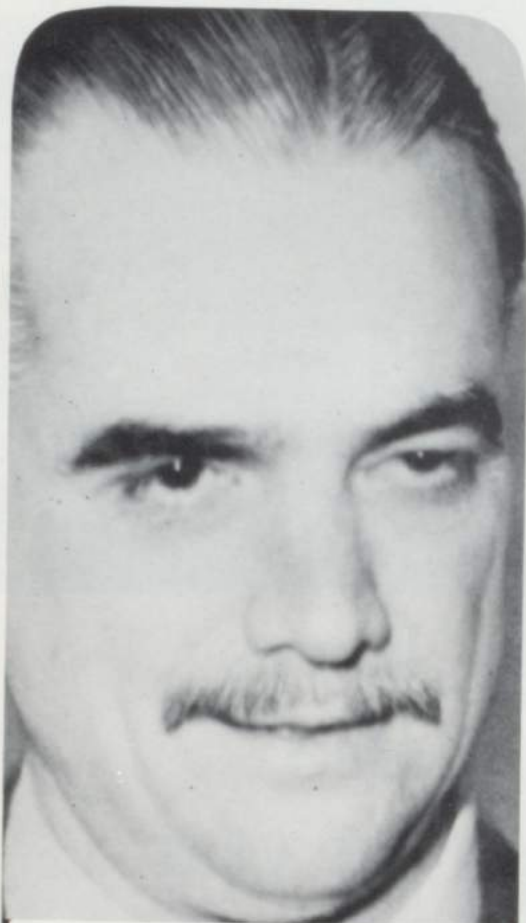

Whatever else Howard Hughes was - some termed him eccentric, unpredictable, a rugged individualist - he had a gentle side. He died on April 5, 1976, weighing only 80 lbs., covered with bedsores, attesting to the sad fact that for whatever the reason, the 71 year old billionaire, died of a sad case of neglect, with only \$2,000 cash to his name.



Comedian-actor Freddie Prinze, star of television's 'Chico and the Man,' died Jan. 29, after a team of doctors fought for 33 hours to save the life he decided to take in a fit of despair.

He never regained consciousness. Said Herbert S. Schlosser, President of NBC, 'We shall never know how far he could have gone, how much laughter and pleasure he could have given us all in the years ahead.'



Gary Mark Gilmore was shot to death Jan. 17 by a firing squad in Utah, winning his immediate point but further muddying the waters of controversy over capital punishment in the United States.

The execution of Gilmore removed this basic question from the area of immediate general concern. But that question will still be there, still demand our study and worry. And some day, our decision.

Larry Flynt and "Hustler"



34 year old "Hustler" magazine publisher Larry Flynt was found guilty on February 8 of pandering obscenity and engaging in organized crime. Flynt was immediately sentenced to 7-25 years in prison, and fined 11,000. He said he started "Hustler" because "I wanted to deal with sex. I wanted to write about it as my friends talked about it on the street . . . I did, and it cost me my freedom."

At a news conference he was quoted as saying, "For every American to have the right to choose whatever books or magazines he wants to read, isn't that what freedom is all about?"

I'm not defending the "Hustler" magazine, only the principle of the right to publish it. To people who accuse me of hiding behind the 1 Amendment, thank God we have the 1 Amendment to hide behind, or where would people like William Morrissey (Flynt's judge) have us?"

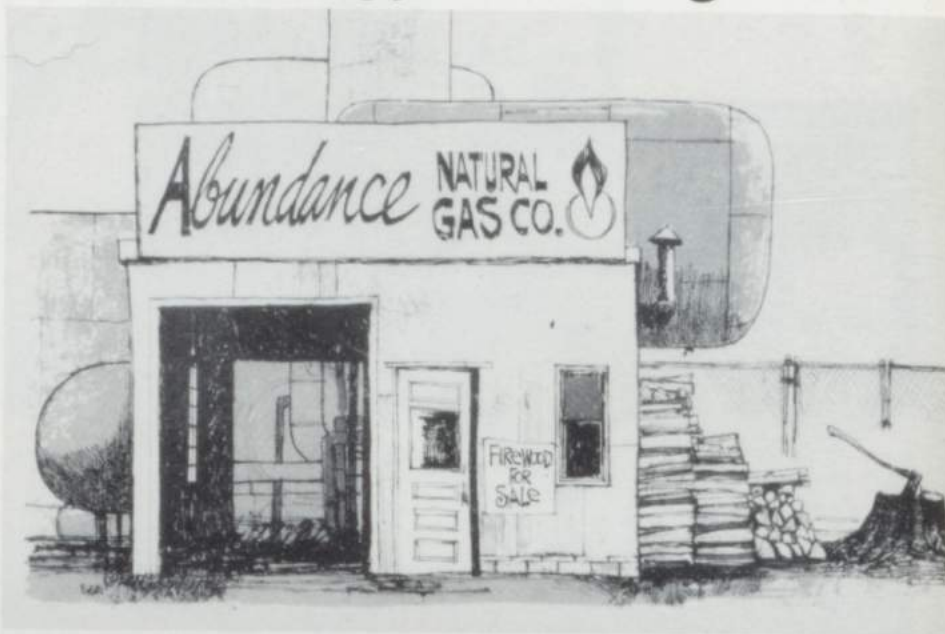
Swine Flu, Legionnaire's Disease, and other exotic maladies.



A bacterium that medical science knows little about is believed to have caused the Legionnaires Disease that killed 29 persons after a convention in Philadelphia last July. After an extensive search, sleuthing scientists declared that the cause of the disease was a bacteria-like organism never before isolated.

Following this discovery, came an outbreak of another unknown disease called Swine Flu. In an effort to thwart an epidemic of this disease, a vaccine was prepared and distributed. The vaccine was then linked to an outbreak of paralysis called Guillain-Barres syndrome, characterized by weakness in the limbs, loss of sensation, diminished reflexes, and sometimes severe paralysis. When the paralysis was linked to the vaccine, it was halted, and studies begun to determine why the 2 were linked.

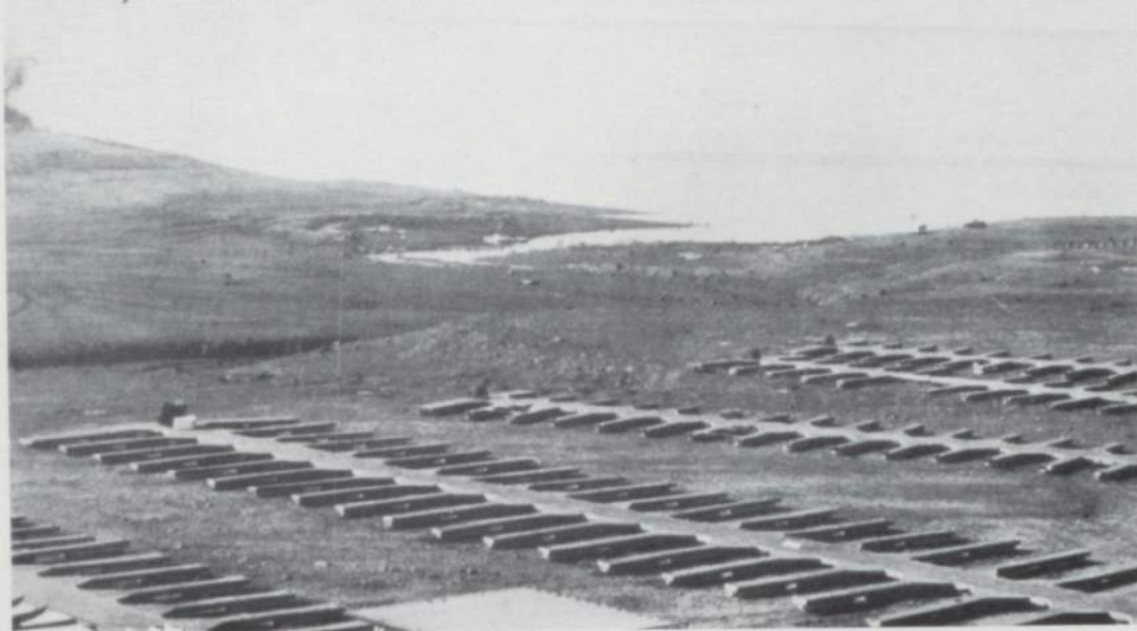
The Energy Shortage . . .

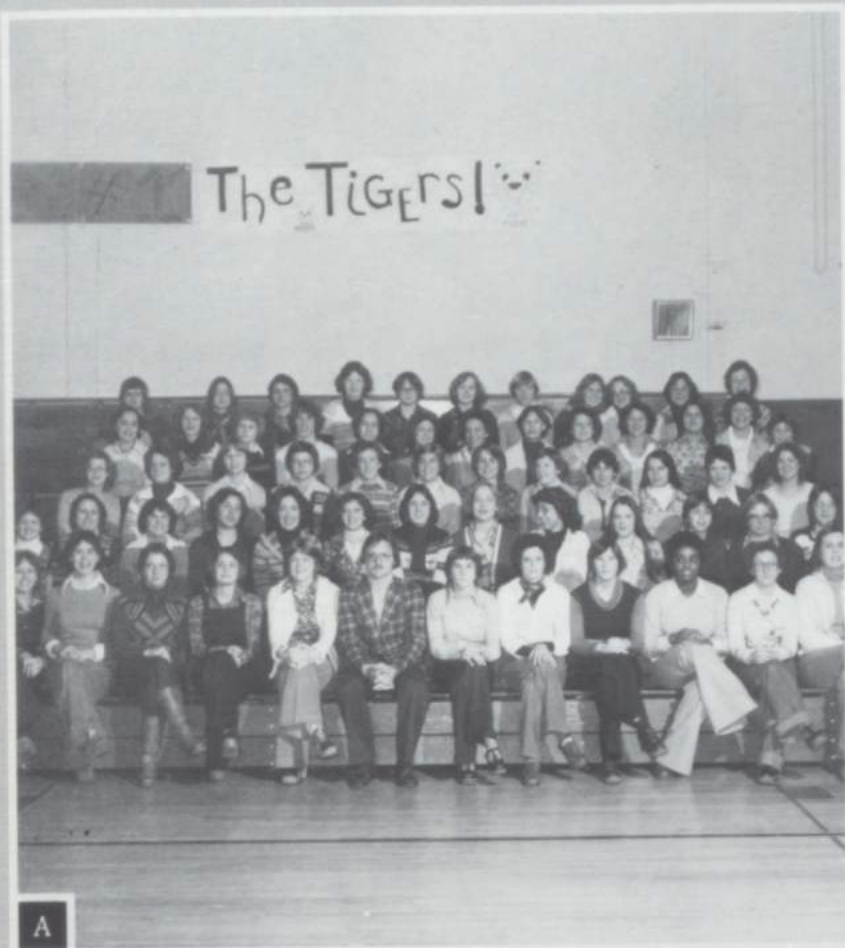

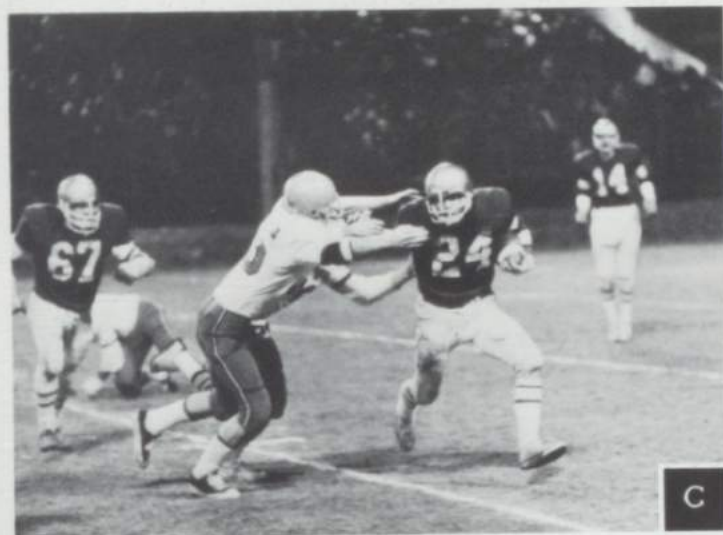
