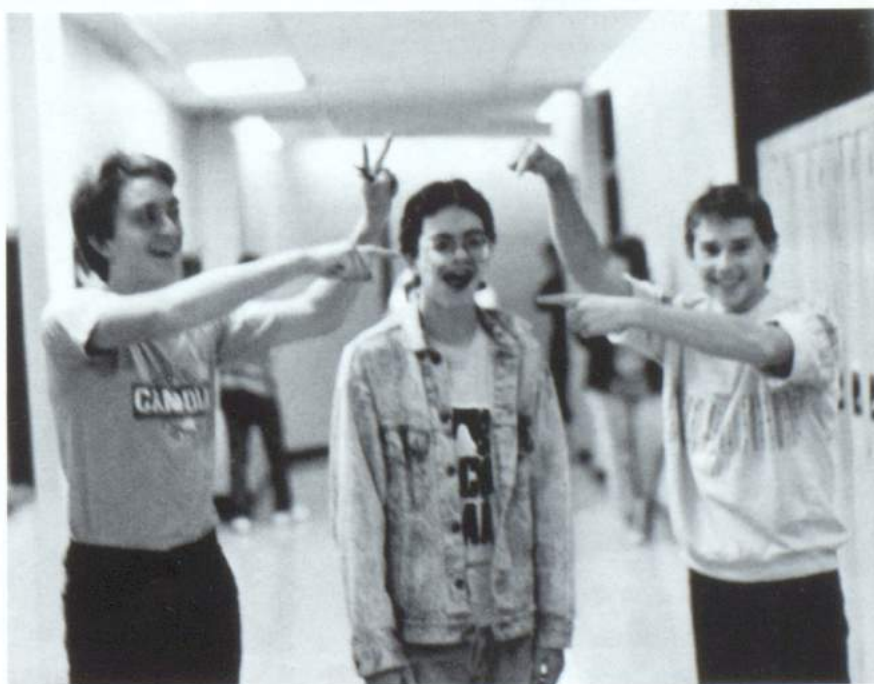

This program has the advantage of coordinating theory and practice for the benefit of the student, school, and employer. It is a plan whereby business students may receive Regents credit for actual work experience in approved jobs that are related to a course in which they are enrolled. Students who maintain satisfactory grades and earn a satisfactory job performance rating by their employer and supervising teacher may receive credit. One half unit is earned for working each 150 hours up to a maximum of two credits per year for 600 or more hours. The group meets periodically with the advisor, Mr. Dupkanik, in school.

Once, near the beginning of each school year, the co-ops and their parents/guardians meet with business teachers and school personnel to have an orientation meeting. Eight different businesses are participating during 1988-89 by providing employment for our business students.

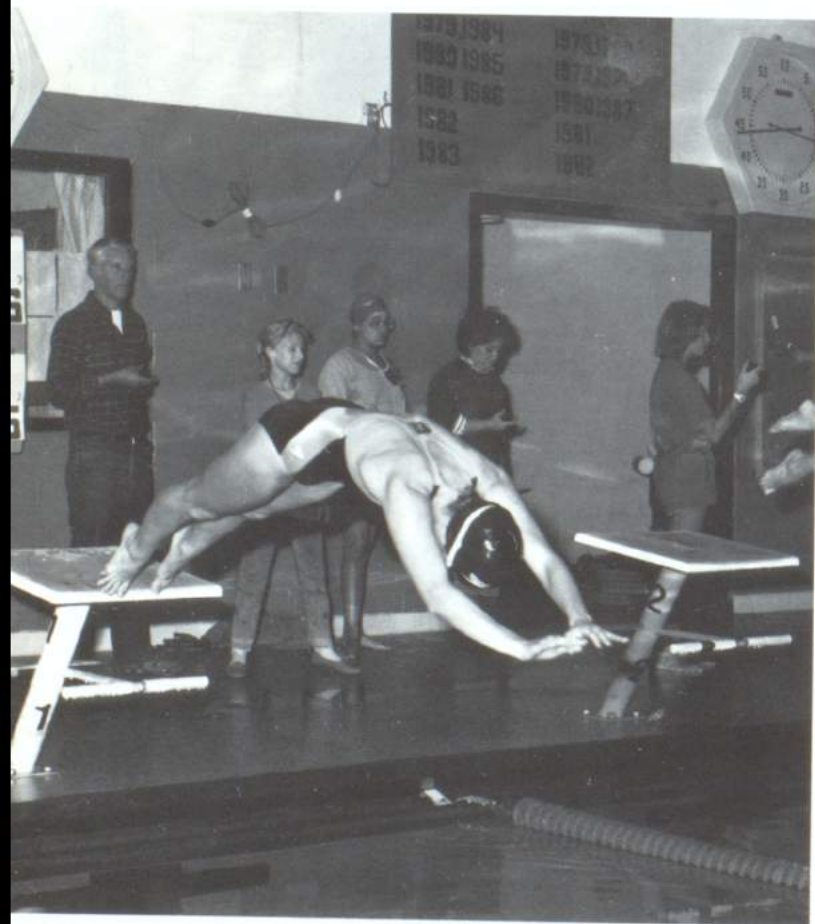


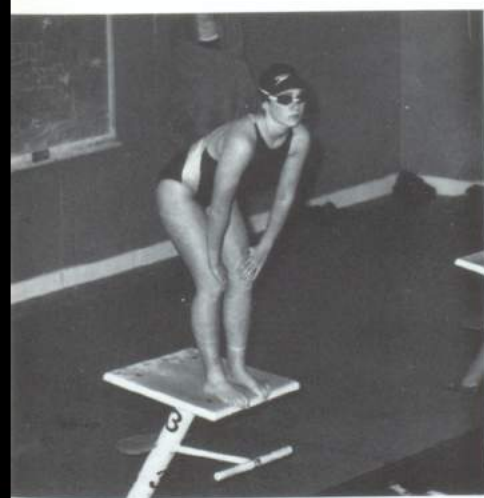

Girls Varsity Swimming

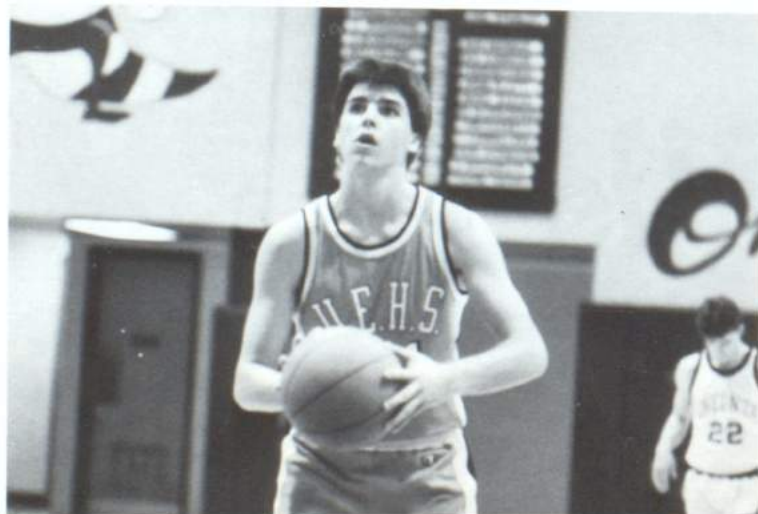
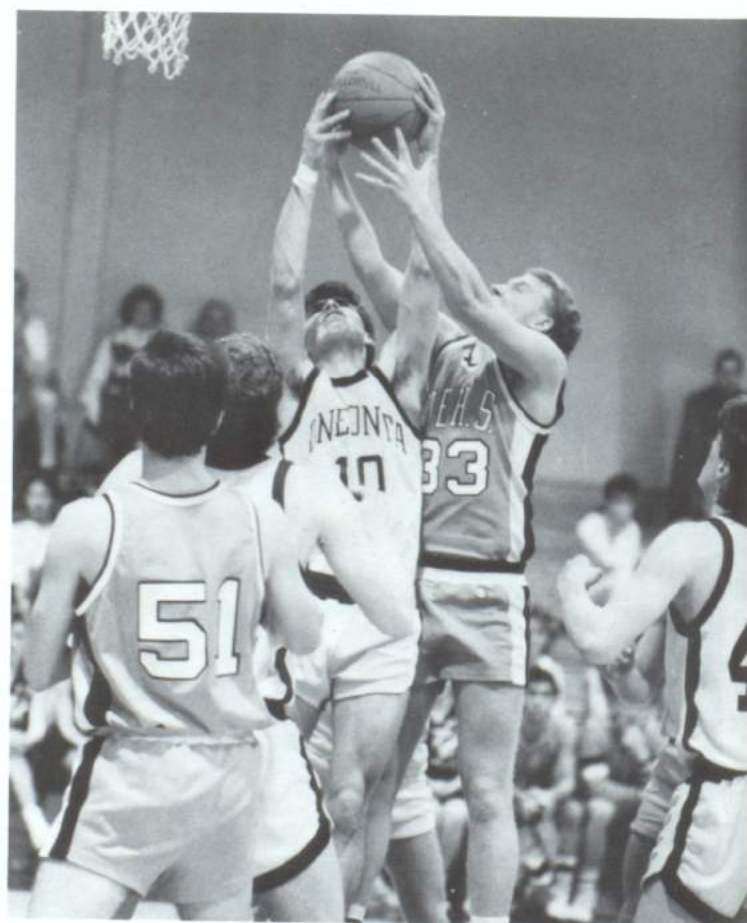
Varsity Basketball

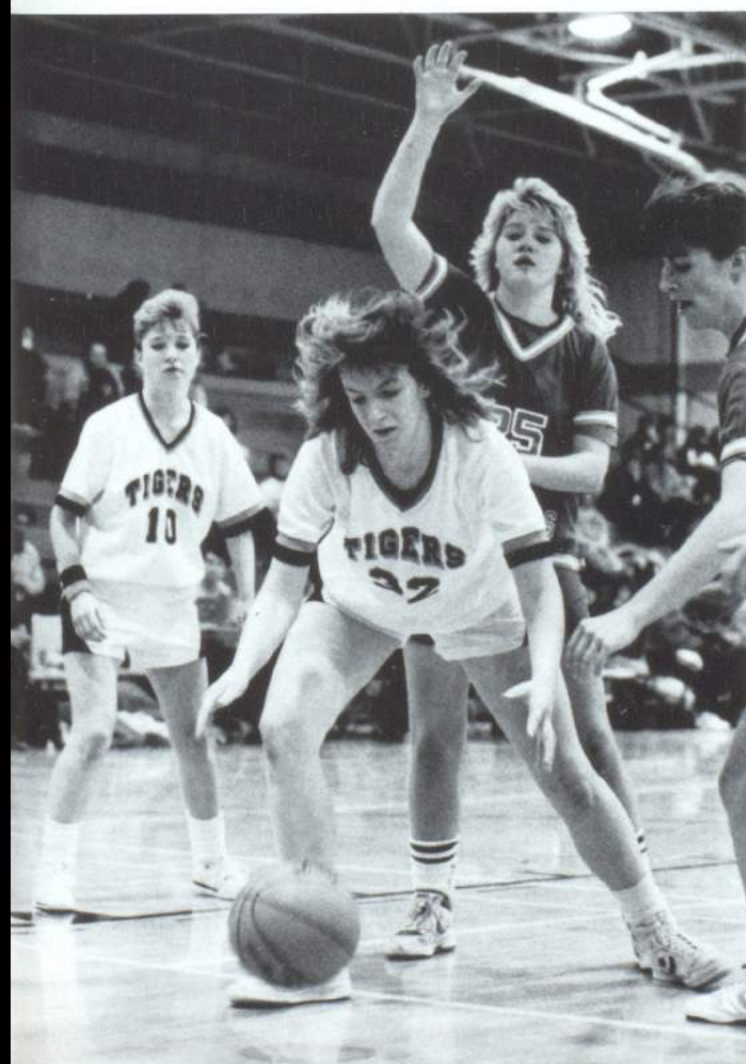

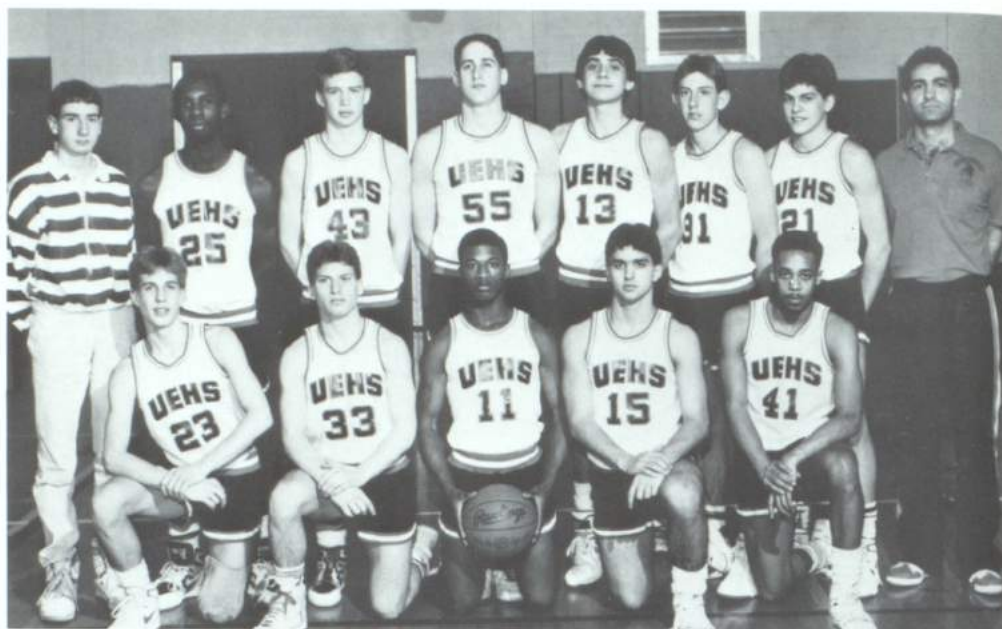

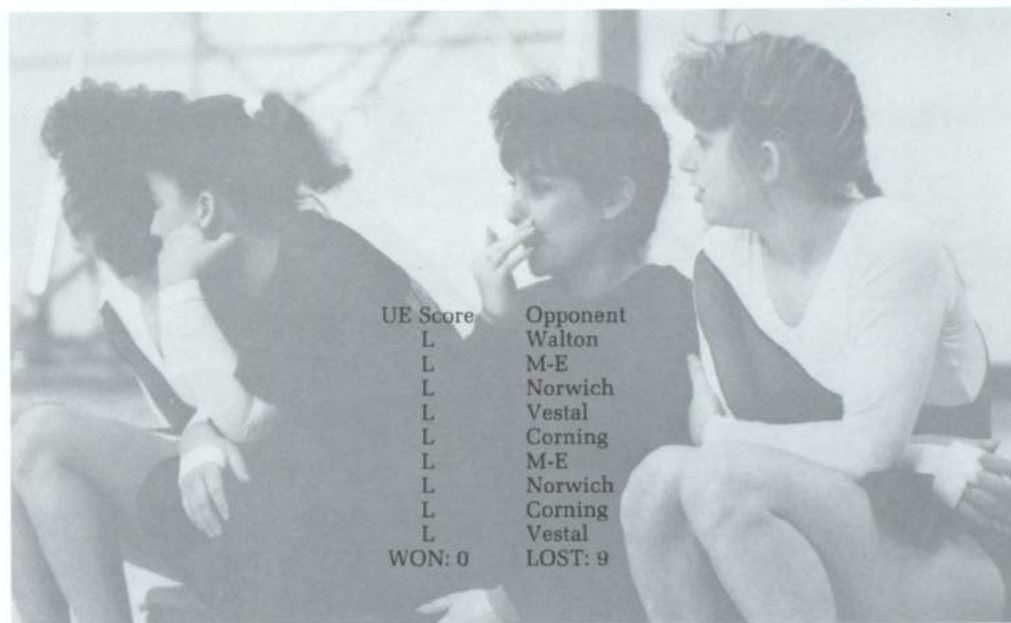
Tiger Tumblers

An Arrow From The Sky

A handful of demonstrators had picketed earlier outside the gate. "Stop the air shows," their posters demanded. "We're afraid." But inside Ramstein Air Base, the atmosphere was "like a huge folk festival," said Hans Siedel who, together with 300,000 other spectators, gathered for the annual aerobatics display at the sprawling U.S. facility in West Germany. As the crowd enjoyed the perfect weather, 10 pilots from Italy's Tricolori (Three colored Arrows) zoomed into their showiest act. Nine jet trainers traced a heart in the sky with trails of colored smoke; a tenth peeled away, then doubled back, in an attempt to "pierce" the heart. Within seconds, however, it was clear that something was wrong. "The solo plane was going too slow," Siedel recalled. "Suddenly it brushed another plane." Two jets crashed to the airfield below; the solo plane slammed directly into the crowd. "I crouched to my knees," said Siedel. "A woman next to me was on fire."

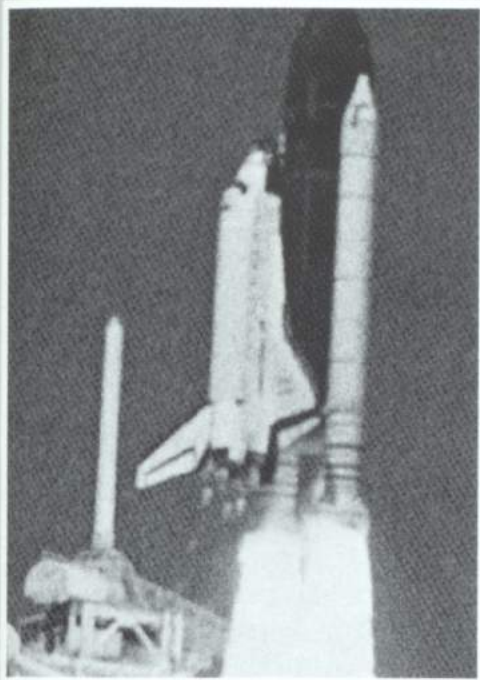

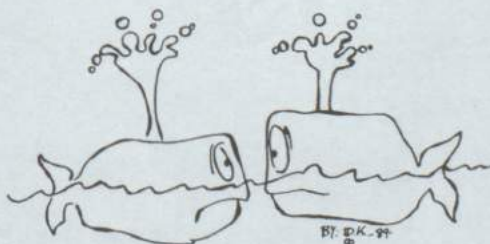

Pan Am Flight 103 A Christmas Tragedy

There was no Mayday call, no radio message at all — just a grim silence as air-traffic controllers watched the green electronic blip registering Pan Am Flight 103 break up and scatter. Bound for New York from London, the 747 jumbo jet suffered a horrifying explosion at 31,000 feet, and for three minutes pieces of the plane and the bodies of its passengers cartwheeled to the Scottish countryside below. All 258 aboard and at least 17 Scottish villagers were killed. It could have been an accident, but the early evidence strongly favored terrorist's bomb. The shock of grief spread to waiting relatives at Kennedy's Airport, to the campus of Syracuse University, where 35 exchange students would never return. Everywhere, it seemed the joy of Christmas sadly dimmed.
