This clip from the 1948 yearbook shows the traditional bonfire before the big UE vs. Central football game. Binghamton Central was traditionally the biggest rival in UE football.



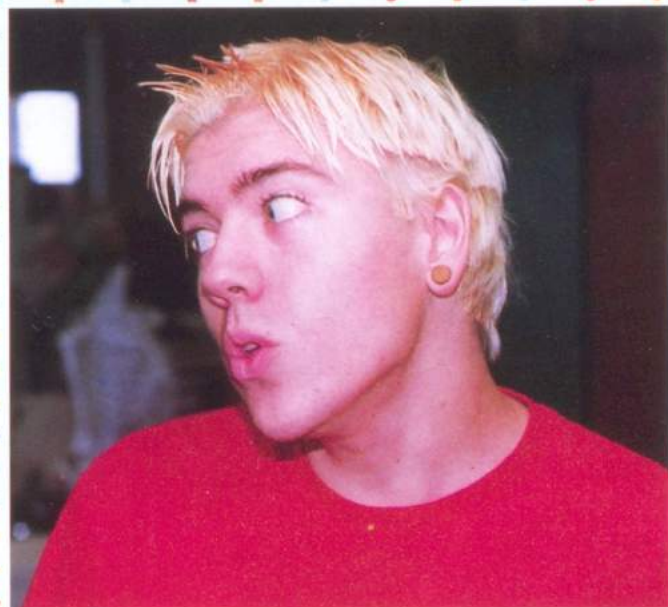

By remembering what I'd said!

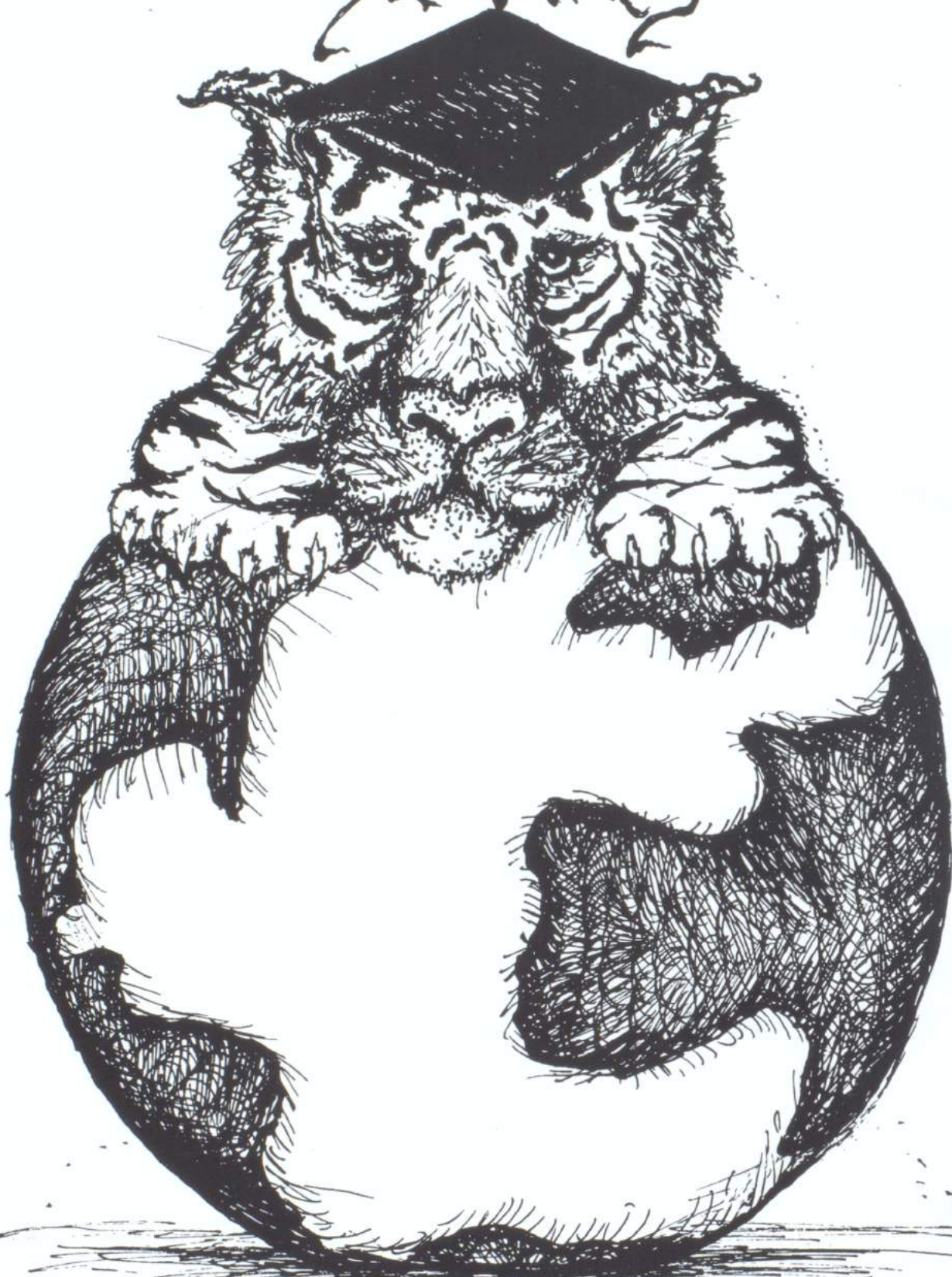

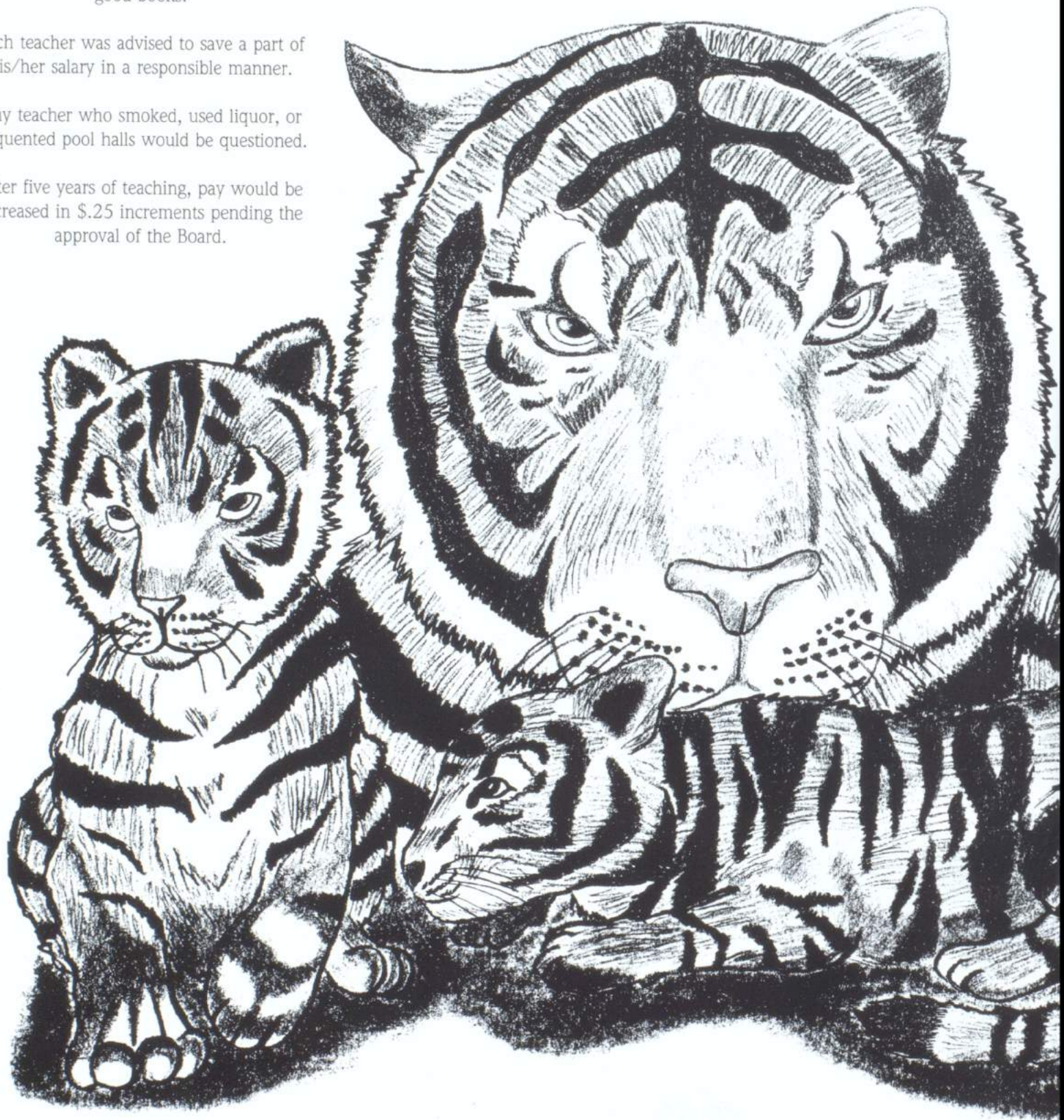
Ten hours were spent every day teaching and planning; teachers were advised to spend the rest of the day reading The Bible or other good books.

Any teacher who smoked, used liquor, or frequented pool halls would be questioned.

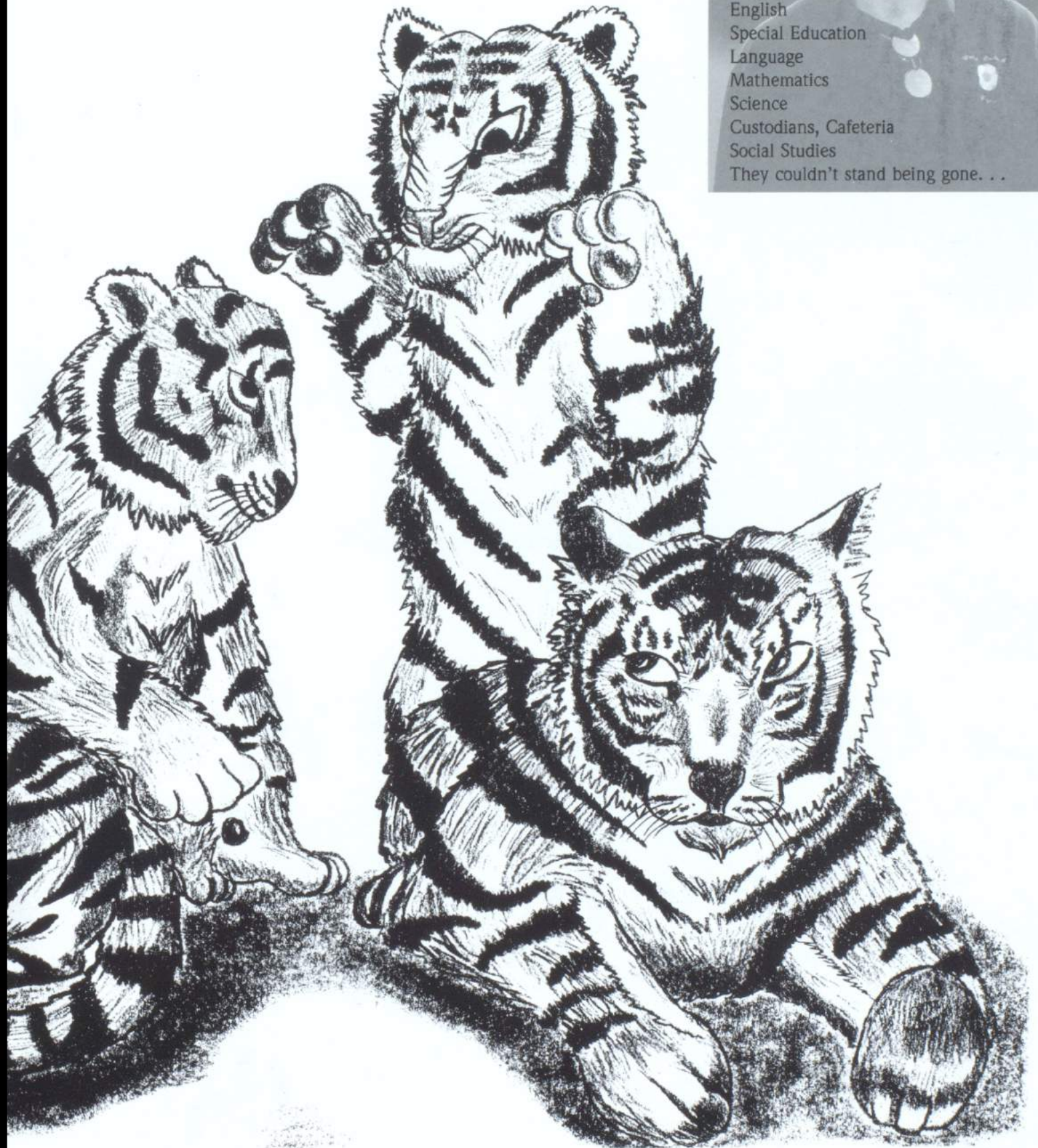
After five years of teaching, pay would be increased in \$.25 increments pending the approval of the Board.

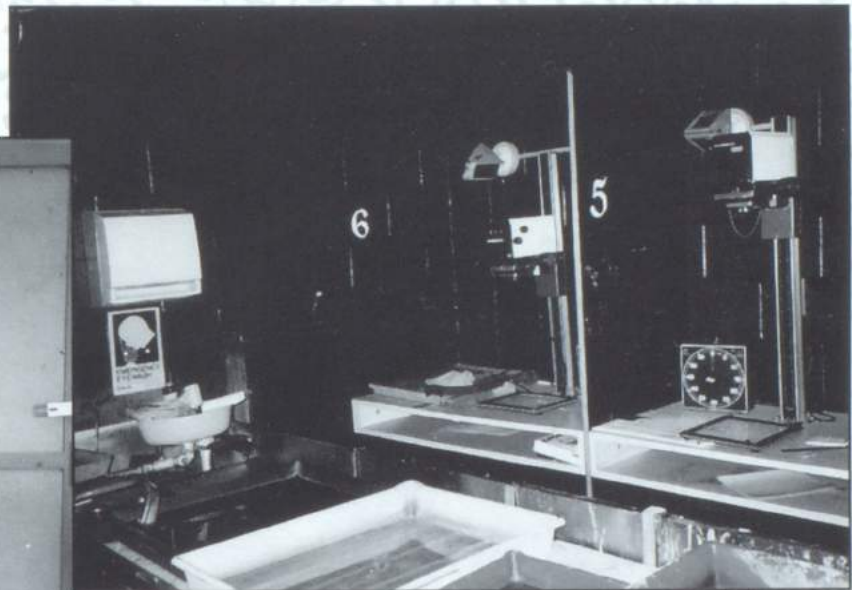
ACTIVITIES

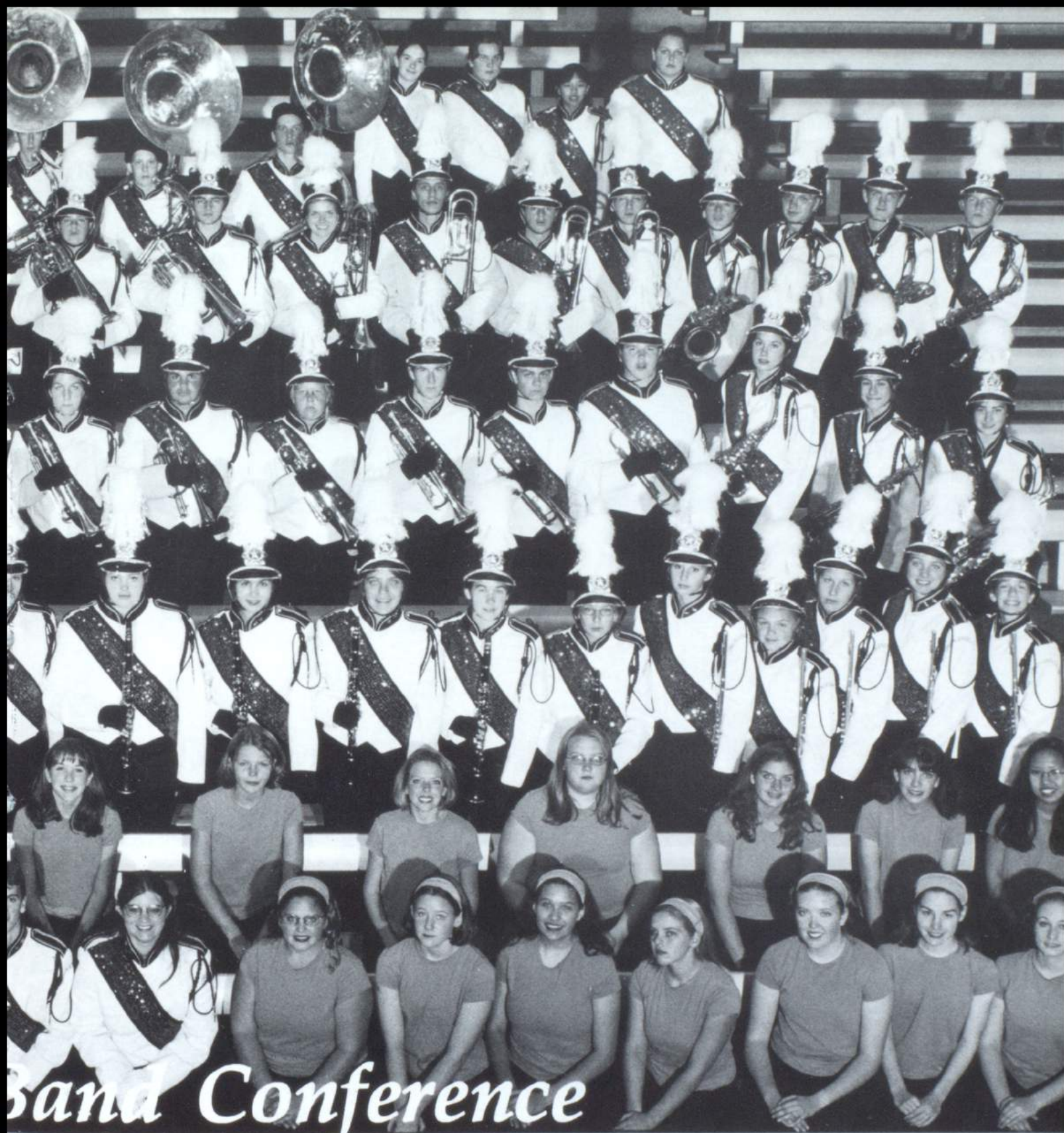

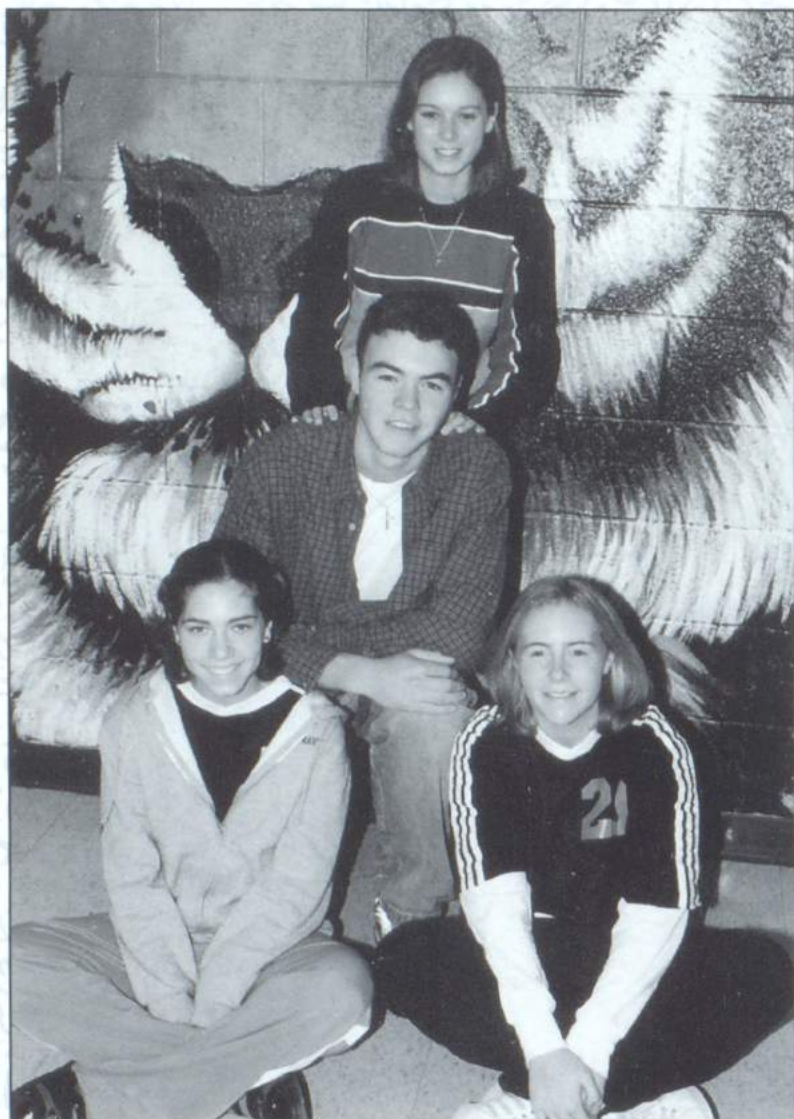

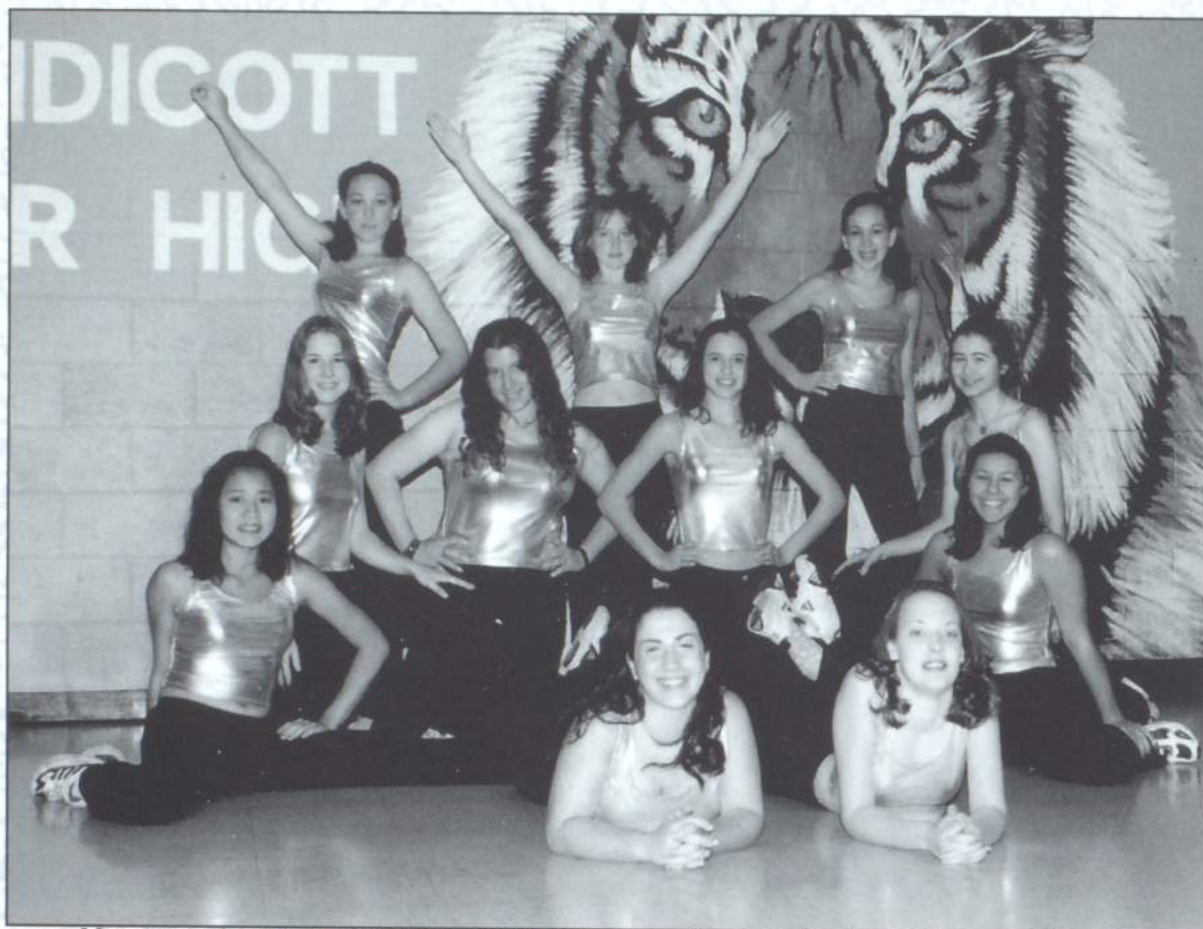

In 1948 after the atrocities of WWII, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was accepted by the United Nations. This declaration supported basic human rights: freedom of expression, freedom of association, and guaranteed due process of law in legal matters. By 1961, Amnesty International was founded to help enforce this declaration, aiding political prisoners and others detained for reasons of conscience throughout the world.

Amnesty International is an organization whose purpose is to promote the observance of human rights worldwide, working to free those imprisoned for their nonviolent political beliefs or activism, and those who are victims of torture and injustice. The club members write letters and sign petitions on their behalf.

The U-E Tiger was the first school-wide publication in the high school, which appeared in the 1930s. Students had never had a newspaper or a yearbook, and were very impressed with a publication that was so accessible. The magazine won awards in competitions.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE

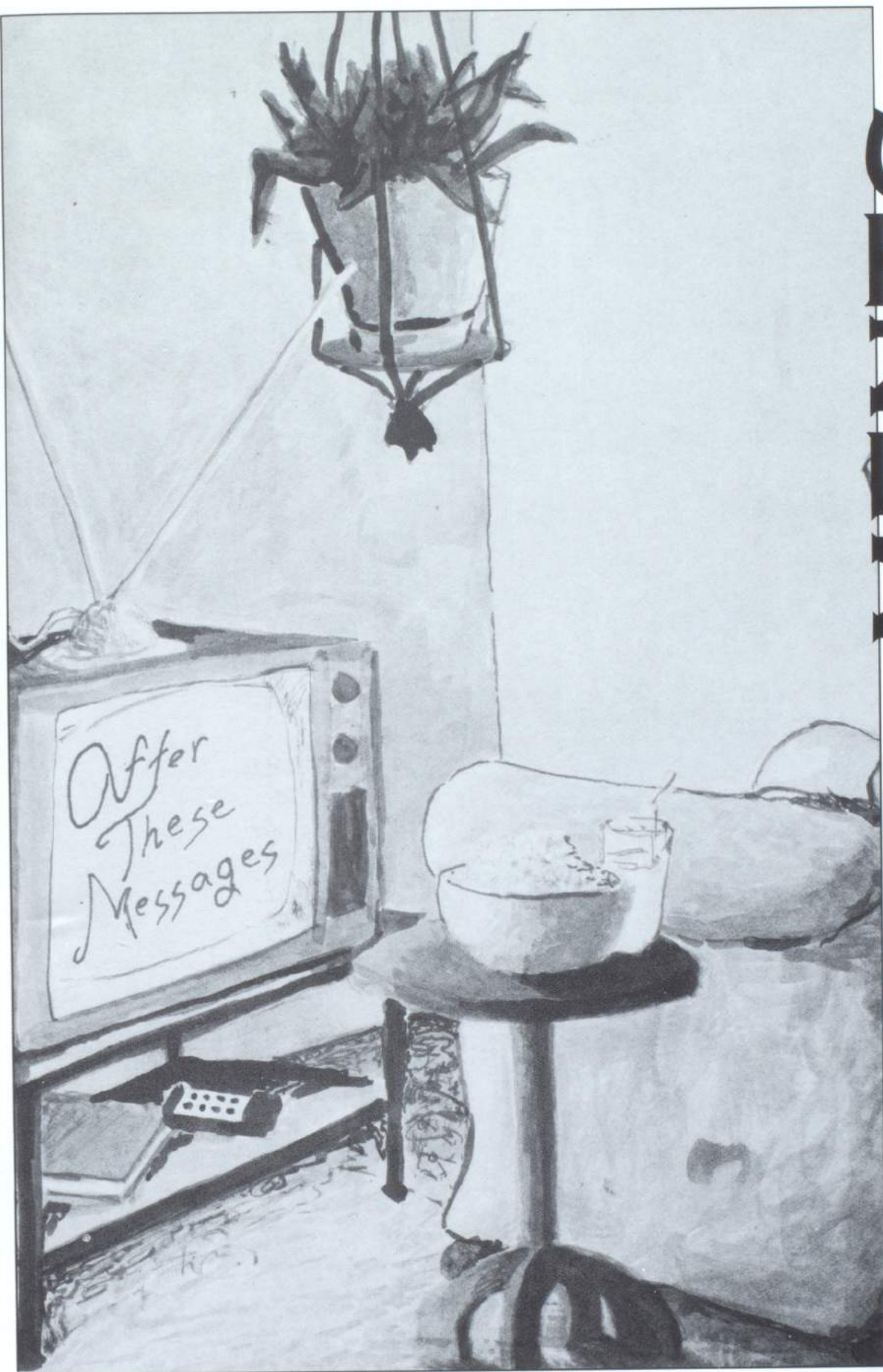
