### Highland Park Story Time

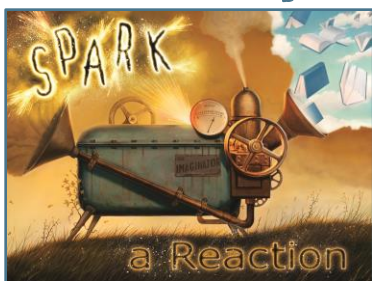
Thursdays @ 9:30 or 10:30 am (7/10 - 8/7)
