Ancestry.com for Beginners Part 1 - Wednesday, September 2, 2020 at 7 p.m.

Are you interested in researching your family tree but do not know where to start? Ancestry.com is the world's most popular consumer online genealogy resource. This workshop will present an overview of the site and offer tips on how to navigate through the different sections. Users can search U.S. census records, Social Security records, birth and death records, immigration records, military and other vital records. This workshop is targeted for beginners.

Ancestry.com for Beginners Part 2 - Wednesday, September 9, 2020 at 3 p.m.

We will continue to explore ANCESTRY, the world's most popular consumer online genealogy resource. This workshop will focus on exploring military records, immigration records, and public family trees. We will also check out the "Card Catalog" which is a listing of all the databases on the site searchable by title or theme. This workshop is targeted for beginners.

Internet 101: Understanding and Searching the Web - September 23rd, at 1:00 p.m.


