Hi, my name is Nina B. Sandvik. I am from Stavanger, Norway, joining AISE; American Intercultural Student Exchange Program.

The school system in Norway is quite different from the one you have here. Norway only requires nine years of school, but most people go to what we call gymnas, more like early college level, or to a trade school for three years. Then you decide if you want to continue going to university or other schools.

The U.S. is great! My first impression, I remember, was that everything is sooo big here: cars, roads, schools, etc. And without very many conveniences all American people and the whole society are also very dependant on the car; Drive in restaurants, drive in banks, etc. I love the people here. Everybody is so friendly, and I would like to thank teachers, friends, and not to mention my host families; the Fabians in Endwell and the Dermody's in Walker Road for being so nice to me.

I know that when I go back in August this year, I will go back with joy — it's been a year worth remembering!

My name is Eva Nicolajsen and I am from Denmark. There are many different things in my school in Denmark than U-E. We just have to go to school for nine years. So I have graduated already. The first time you start school is when you are seven years old. The first seven years you can choose what subjects you want to take. The last two years we have a couple of choices. I think it is good that you here can choose between so many English courses, etc. We start school at eight o'clock and get out about two to three o'clock different everyday. We have no homeroom or any study halls. We stay in one or a couple of classrooms during the day, while the teacher goes to rooms. We bring our books home every day because we do not have lockers. We only have gym two times a week. But we have after school sports you can join, along with clubs. In the weekends we usually enjoy sport and the discos.

Last year I took one year of college, and I am going back for two more years next summer. I have plans to be a policewoman.

In Denmark everything is close to us, we are half and hour from the beach and two hours from Germany, and one to two days from other countries in Europe. Here I miss the beach a lot.

Right now I am staying with the family of John and Jennifer March, on Holiday Hill, but in January I am moving to my next family, Robert and Barbra Knoth in Endwell.

The people in U.S. are very friendly and I enjoy being here.





Foreign Exchange Students

Hello, my name is Arnt Rian. I'm from Norway. Our system is as the following. We graduate after 9th grade in Norway, but we don't start school until we are seven, so we're usually fifteen or sixteen when we leave school. Most classes we are required to take in High School are math, Norwegian, English, history, etc., just about everything.

I came to the U.S. because I wanted to be different from others. I've always been for doing something new.

Here in the U.S. I really don't find anything really different, just that you here in the U.S. use artificial ingredients in your pizza and in Norway we use the real stuff.

I'm staying with the Dermody's on Walker Road right now, and I would like to thank them for their hospitality. When I return in the summer, I plan to go back and be a world famous electrician . . . And being able to play my guitar and piano for the rest of my life. That's all.

Hi, my name is Sally Mackay, I'm from New Zealand. U-E is almost twice as large as my school. We have eight separate blocks or classrooms. Like other students in New Zealand, I have to wear a uniform. Most people bring their lunch to school, but we also have a snack bar.

There are so many more ranges of subjects at U-E than at my school. We do not have separate Maths, and also separate English courses. We start school in February, and end in early December for the summer holidays. Instead of semesters, we have three terms in a year, and we have assembly twice a week for twenty-five minutes. We do not graduate, but we all have to take the same two national exams where everyone in the country sits the same exam for each subject. You can leave school at fifteen, but many leave at sixteen or seventeen and get a job, or go to polytech, or trade school. Our main sports are rugby, and cricket. Some of our major sports are soccer, volleyball, basketball, softball, hockey and track. Most people get to school by walking or biking.


Life in the U.S. is different in many ways, because New Zealand is in the southern hemisphere our seasons are the opposite. We drive on the other side of the road, and most of our cars are much smaller. You can get your driver's license at fifteen. There are more appliances in the U.S., probably because they are much cheaper. We only have two T.V. channels. Most of the houses are one story and don't have a basement. Almost every house has a fence around it. We have a McDonald's and Pizza Hut, but no other American restaurants. The weather is much colder in the winter than in New Zealand. We have snow about once every four years and it stays for about two days. The accent is differnt and so are some of your words like jersey-sweater, biscuit-cookie, scone-biscuit, queue-line.


New Zealand is a much smaller place than the U.S. In area it is just over three million.


We do not celebrate Valentine's Day and Halloween is not a big celebration. I'm staying with the Koslowski family, and when I return in the summer I will probably go back to college.

Bottom Right: Three students make use of word processing software in 54 the new writing lab.








A member of the Board of Regents said that the vote should be positive in March, requiring three years of a language with no alternatives for a Regents Diploma. The Board is trying to "Europeanize" New York State by requiring a foreign language. U-E's Language Department believes that the students of U-E will approach a foreign language with a better attitude because it is not an elective, but is required. New York State is betting that every student has an ear for a foreign language, which is not always true.


English Department



When we asked Coach Angeline if he had any comments about this year he said . . .

"Each ream that passes through our proud U-E Football Tradition has its own unique characteristic. The trait that most set this 1983 Team apart from the others was, in our humble opinion, the ability to cope with adversity. What kind of adversity?





Art and Spanish Clubs








