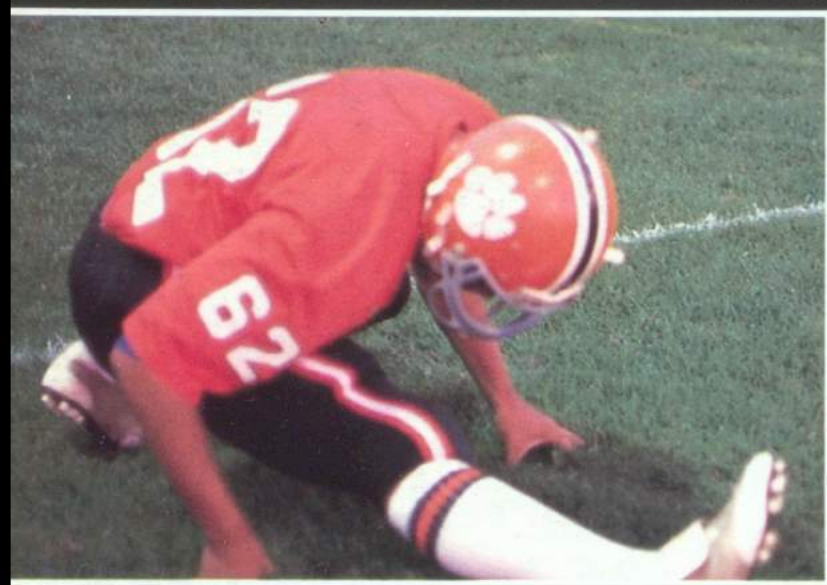

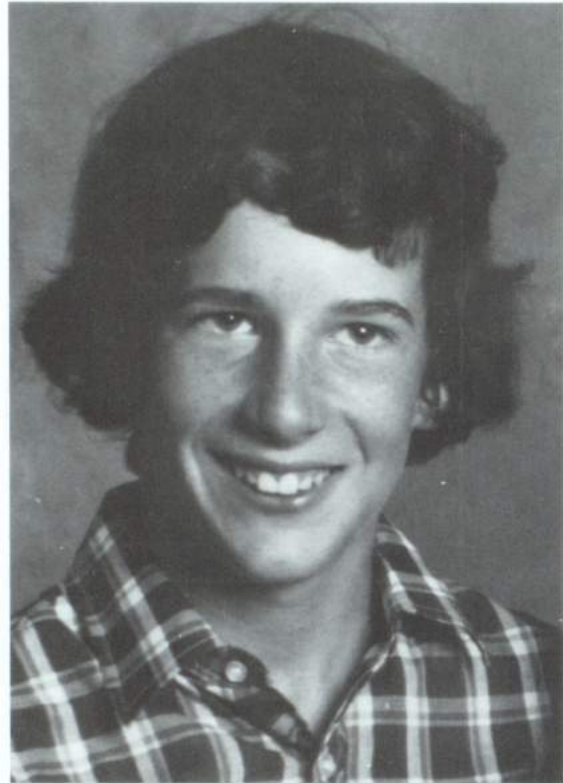
Stephen J. Mehal — October 5, 1967-

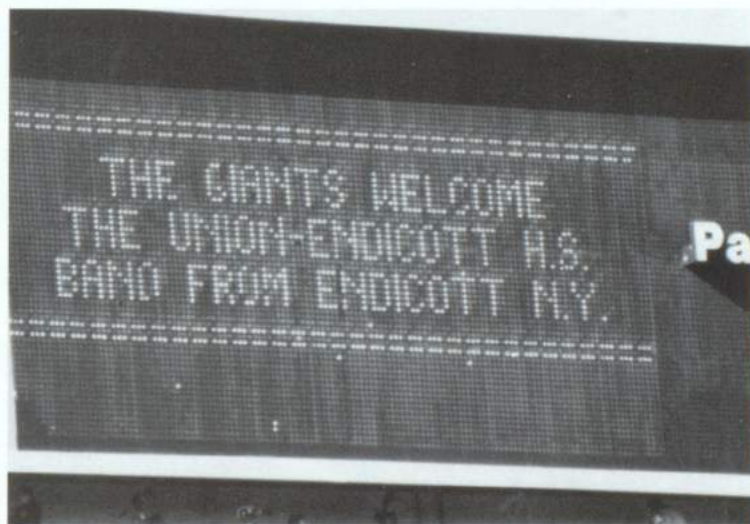

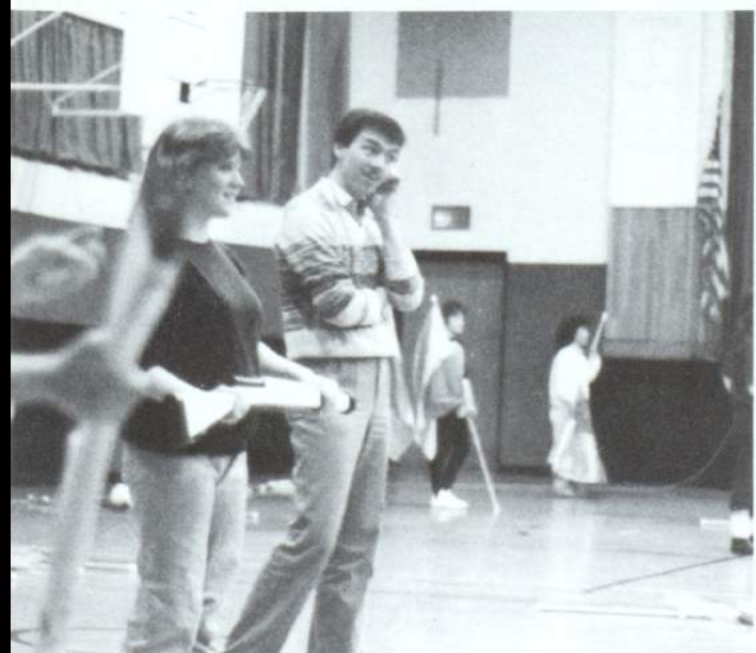
The 1985 Tigerette squad — otherwise known as the "Rockettes of the Gridiron" — has once again lived up to its name with another great season of performances.

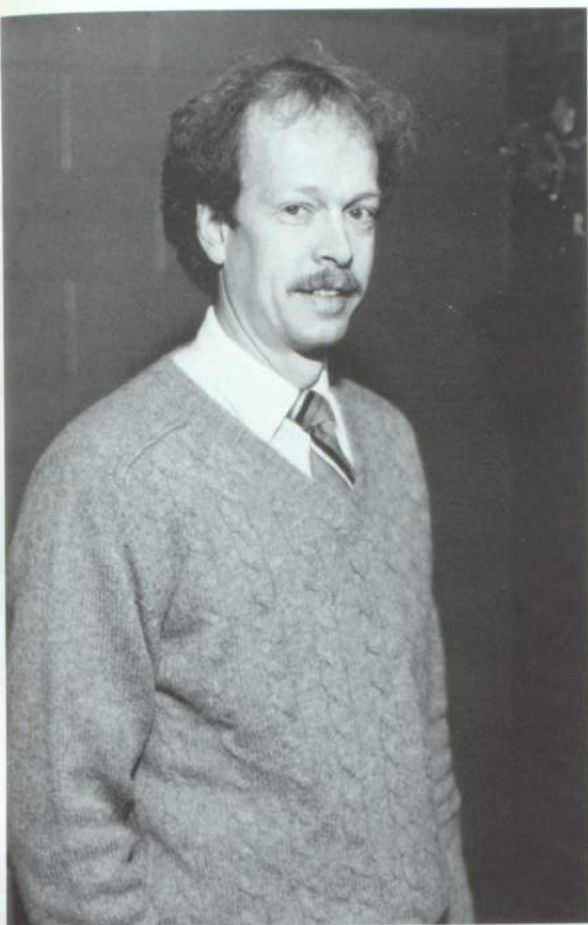

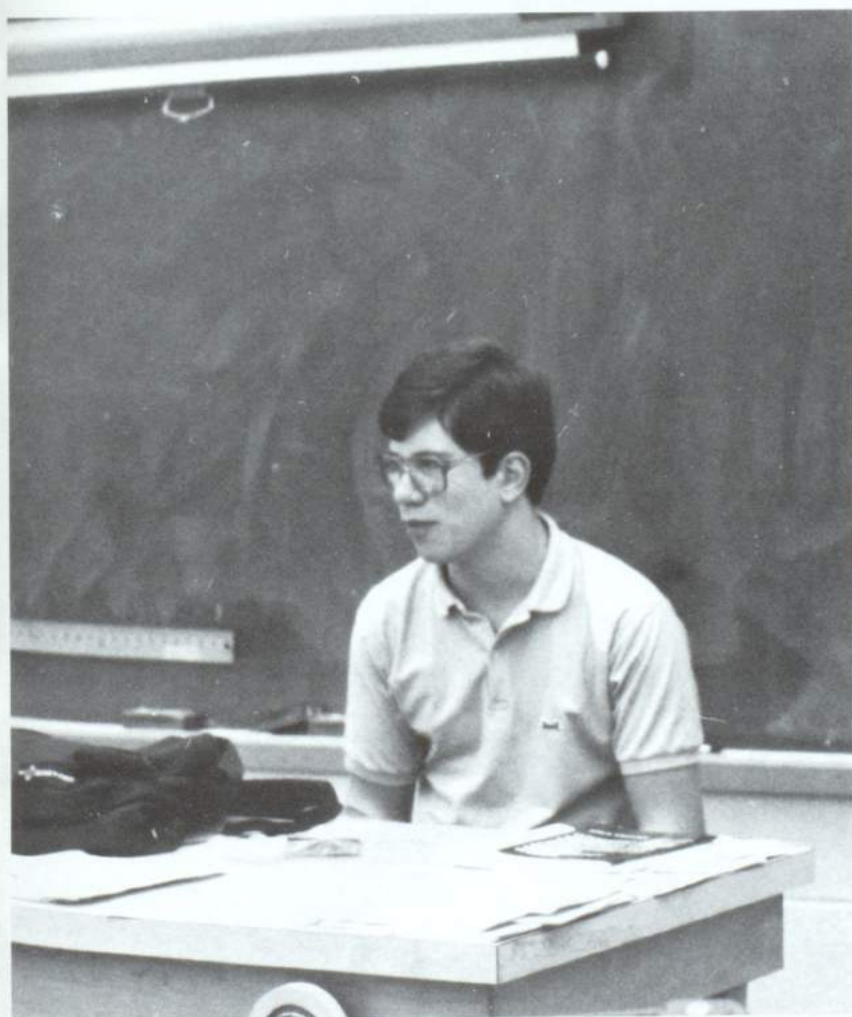

CO-OP AND INDUSTRIAL AWARENESS

The Co-Operative Office Skills Program involves business students receiving regents credit for actual work experience providing the student maintains satisfactory grades and earns a satisfactory job performance rating. Only those enrolled in Shorthand 2, Office Procedures, or Accounting 2 are selected upon the approval of both the Business Education and Guidance Departments.

The Industrial Awareness program is a unique way for high school seniors to earn money while familiarizing themselves with the field of business.

Here at U-E, the Industrial Awareness program is associated with the IBM Corporation. Students either work four hours in the morning or four hours in the afternoon. When school is not in session, the students are permitted to work a full eight-hour day.

Becoming an IA Co-Op is a process that begins in the spring of the student's junior year. After the student receives his counselor's approval, he is free to begin the application and interview phase. If the student is accepted, he is notified of this sometime in June and at the same time is informed of his salary, manager, and place of work.

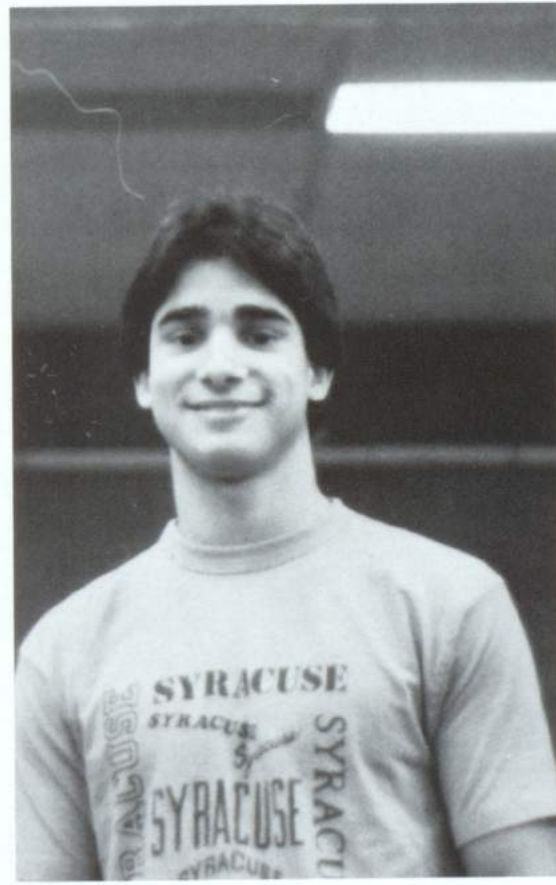
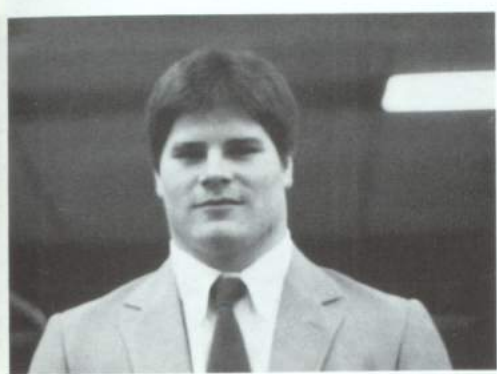

Thanks, Thanks, Thanks to our new advisors Mrs. Dyko and Mrs. Roberto... we couldn't have done it without your help!

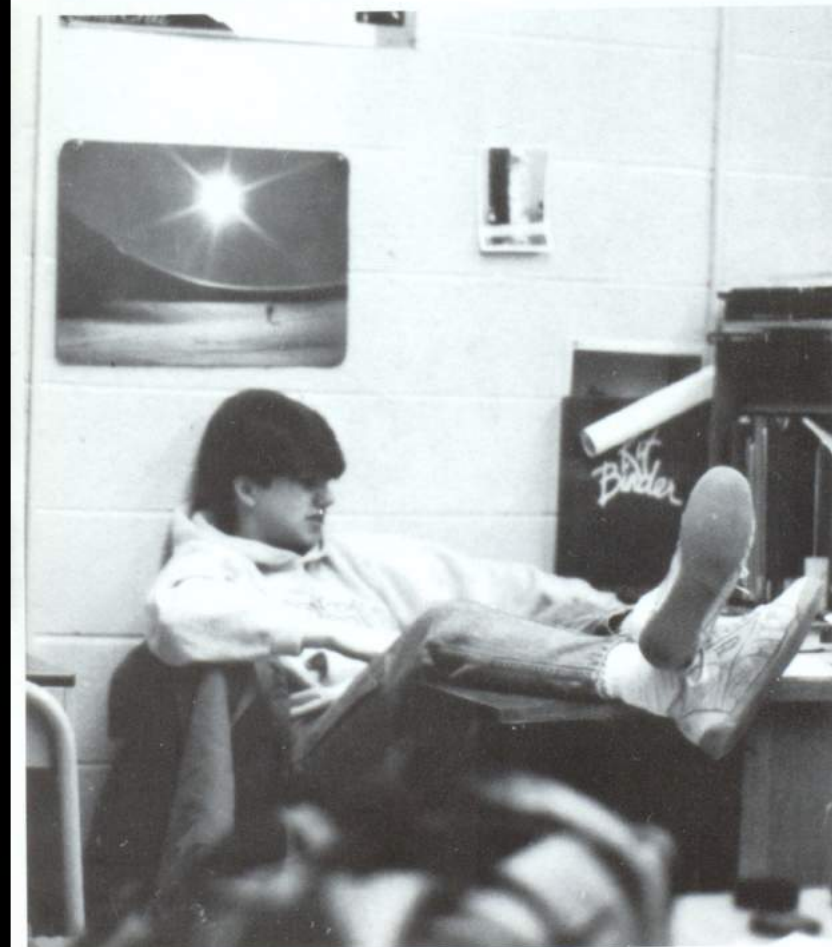
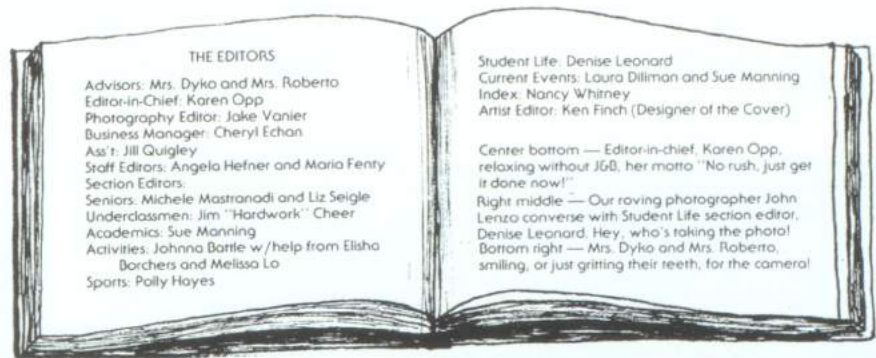

The team may appear in a documentary being produced by WSKG-TV.

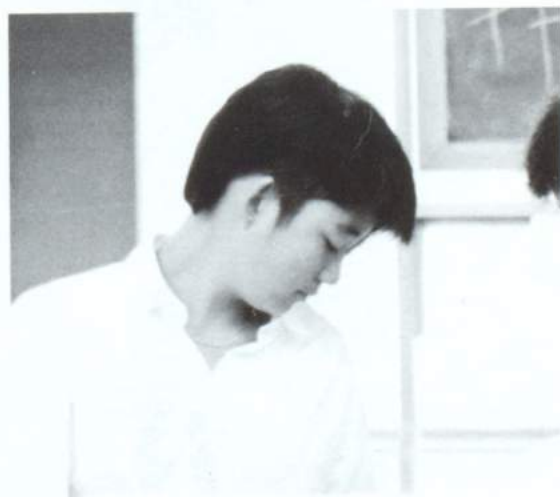

The Italian Club offers scholarships to members who have provided service to the club. The club also participates in all activities dealing with Italian culture, theatre, etc. in the community.

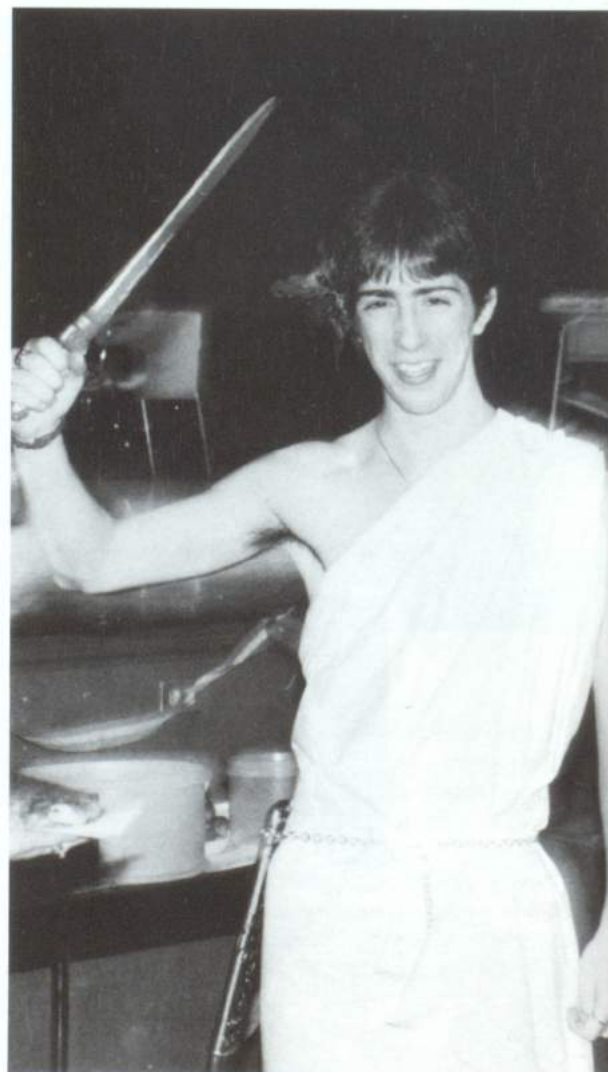

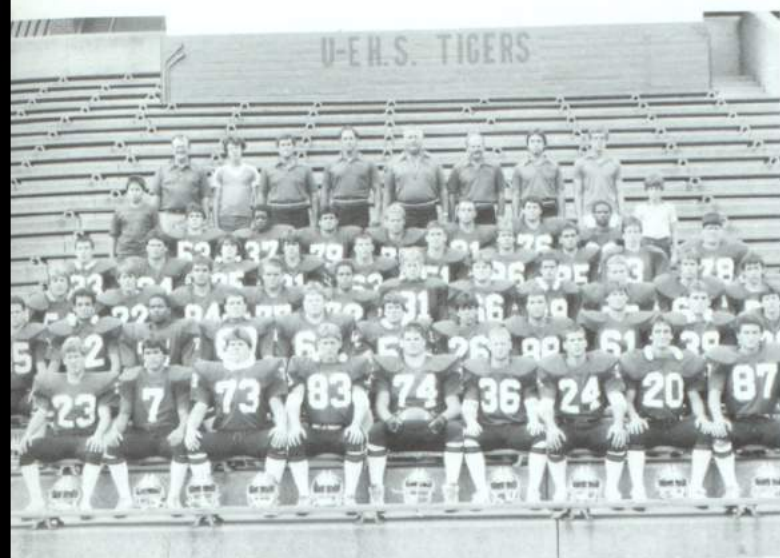

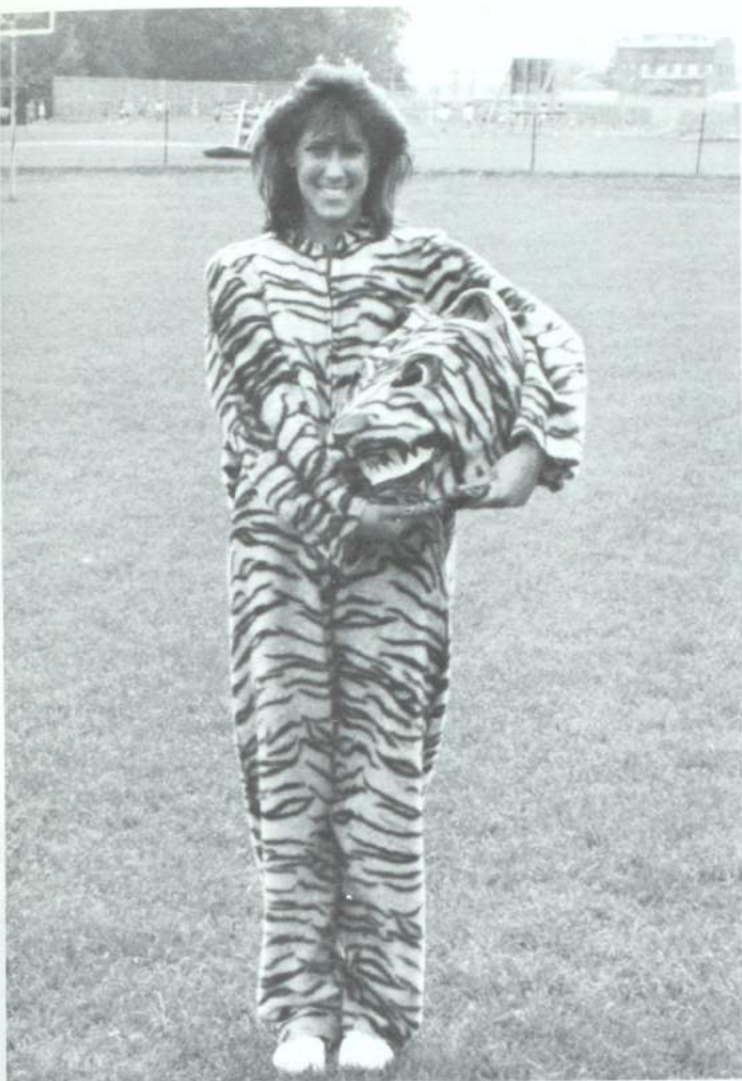

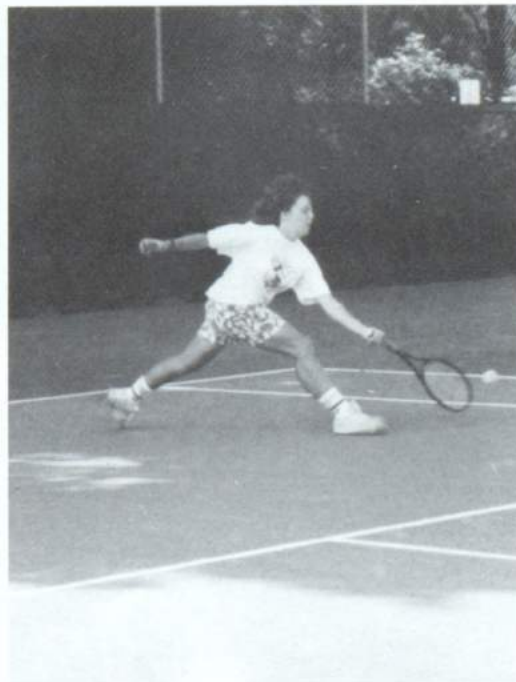

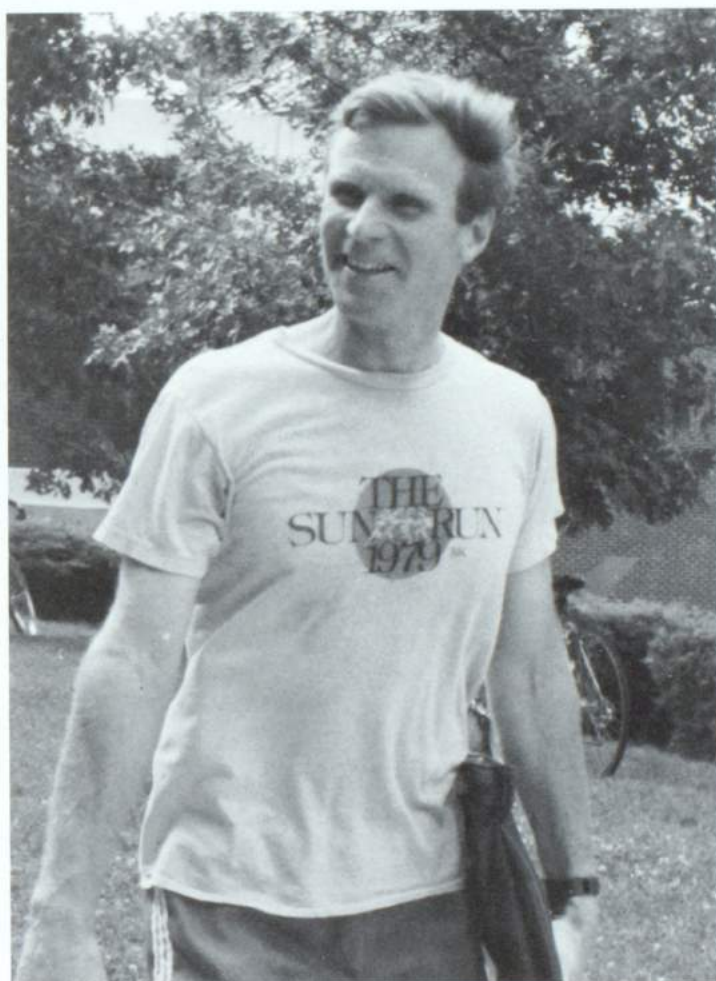
Cross-Country running takes a lot of time, practice, and dedication, to run a 3.1 mile course with hills.

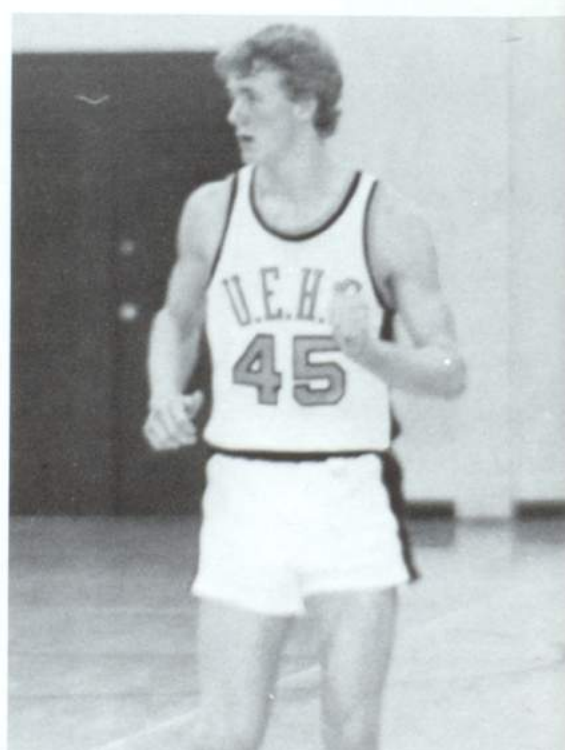

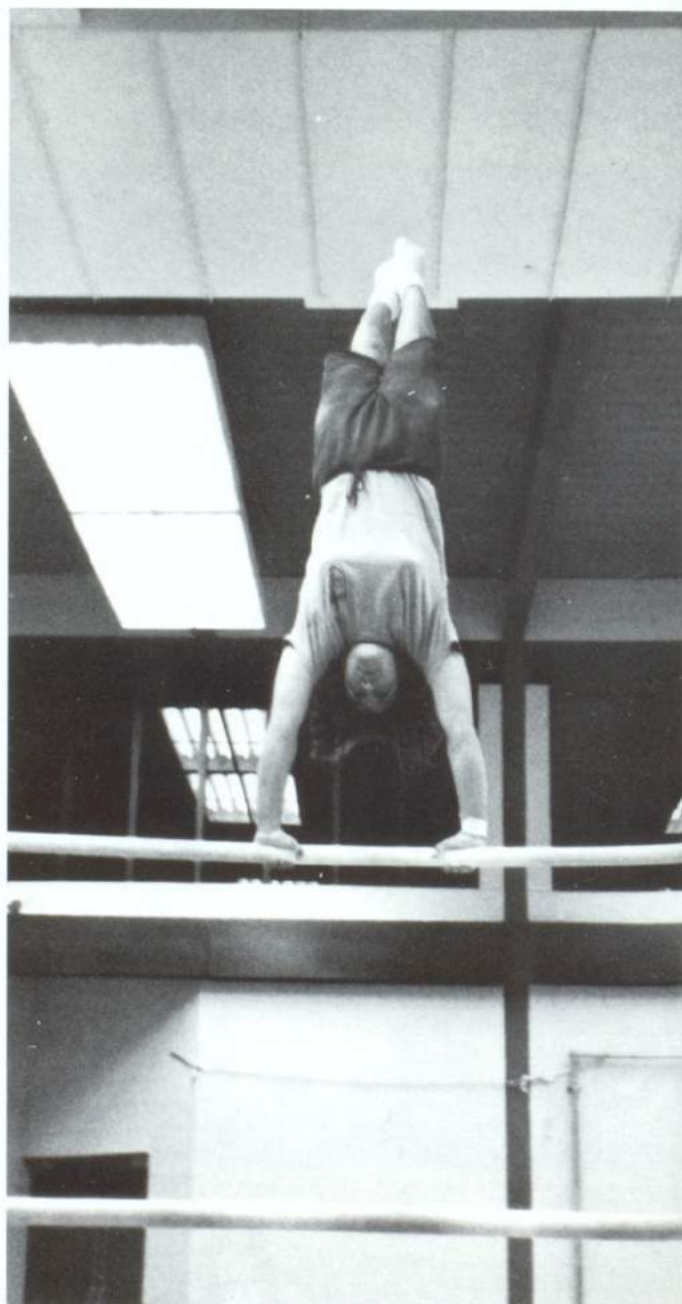

THE REGIONAL CHAMPIONS

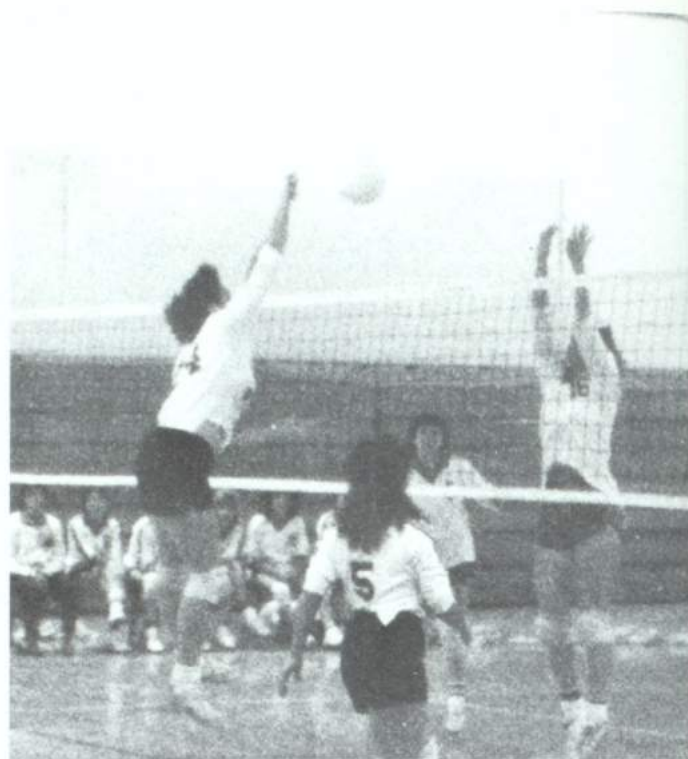

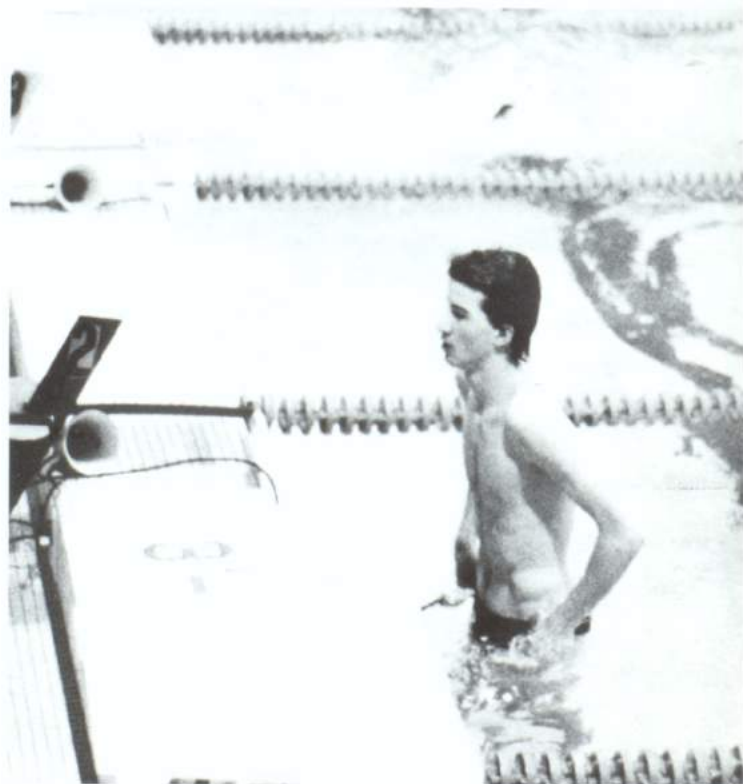
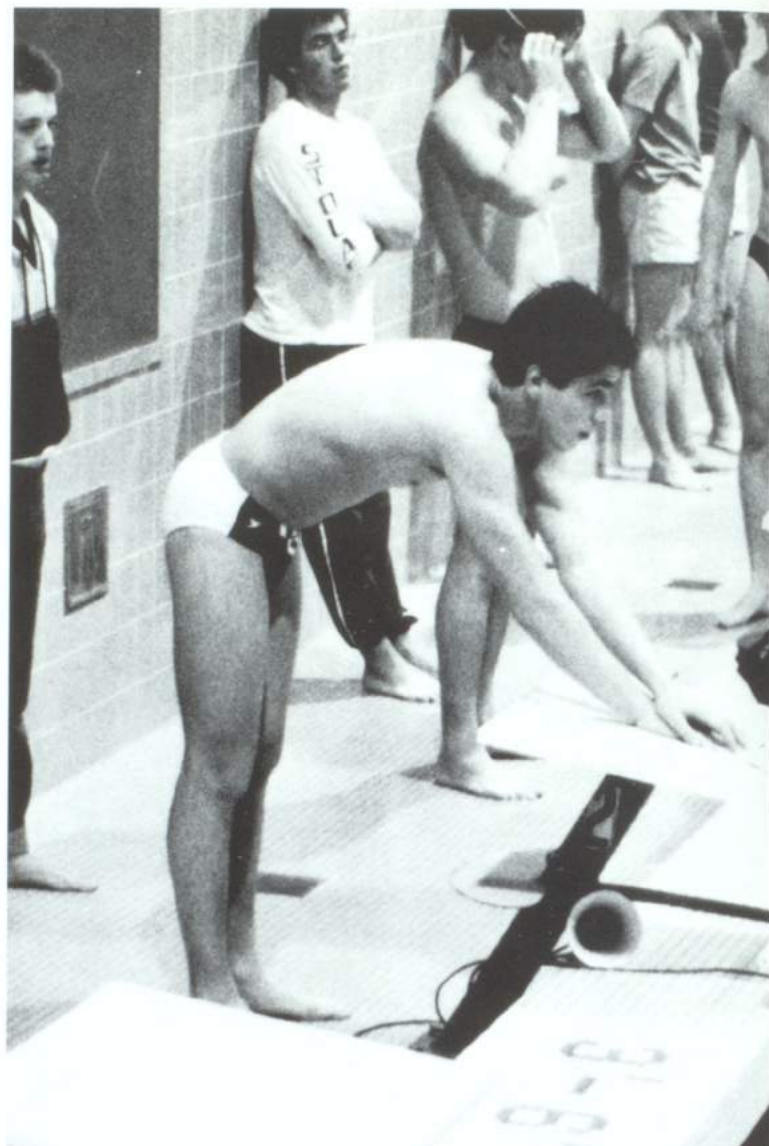


ANOTHER FINE SEASON FOR THE BOYS

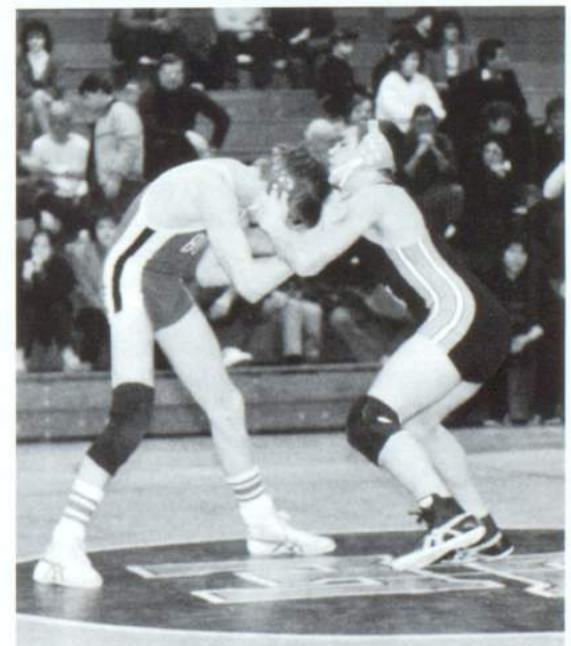

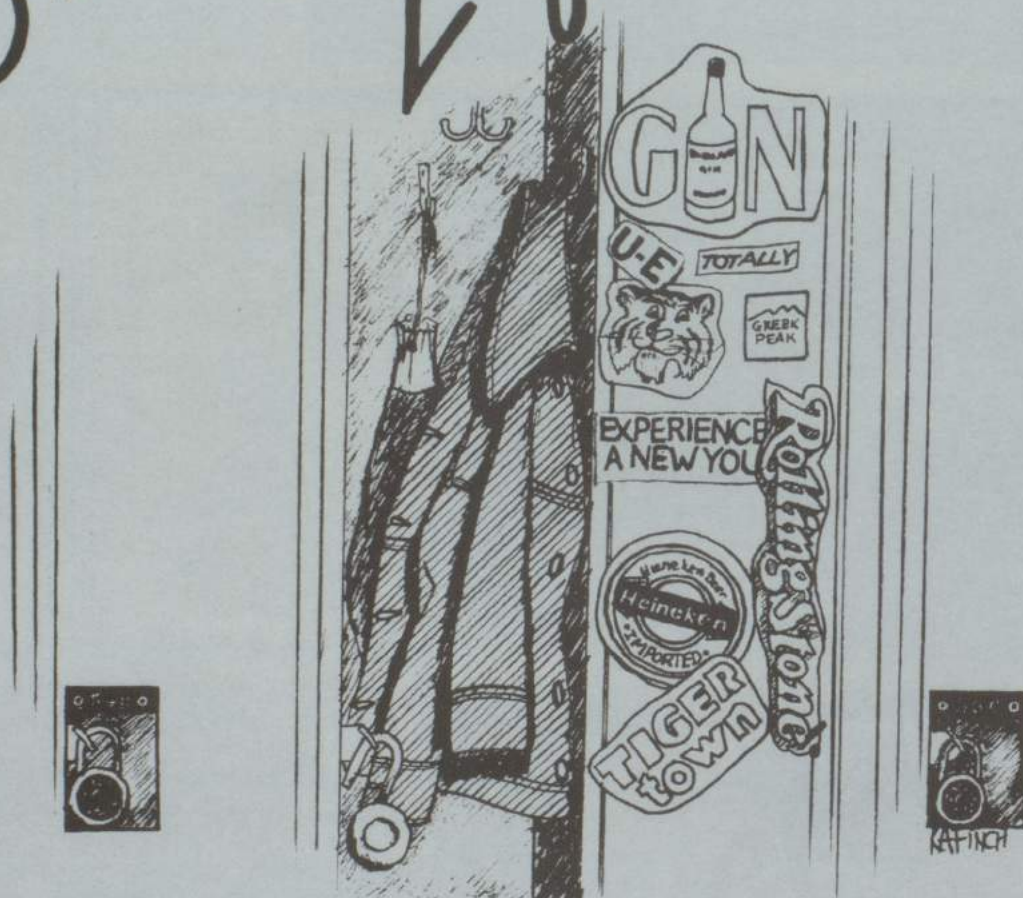

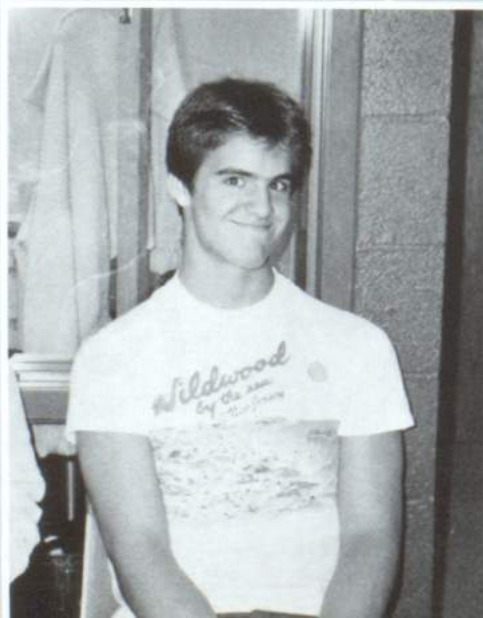

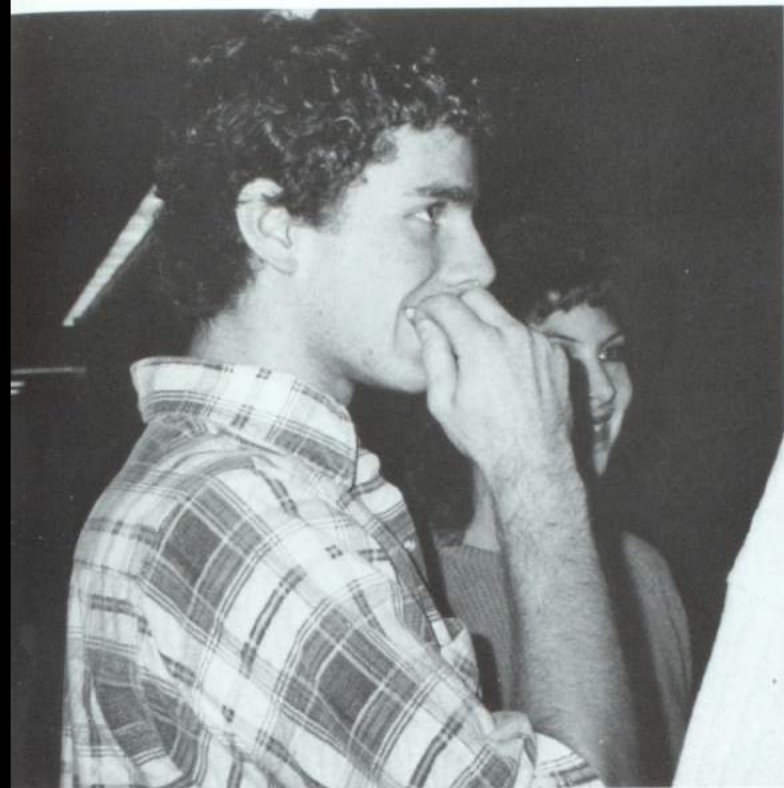

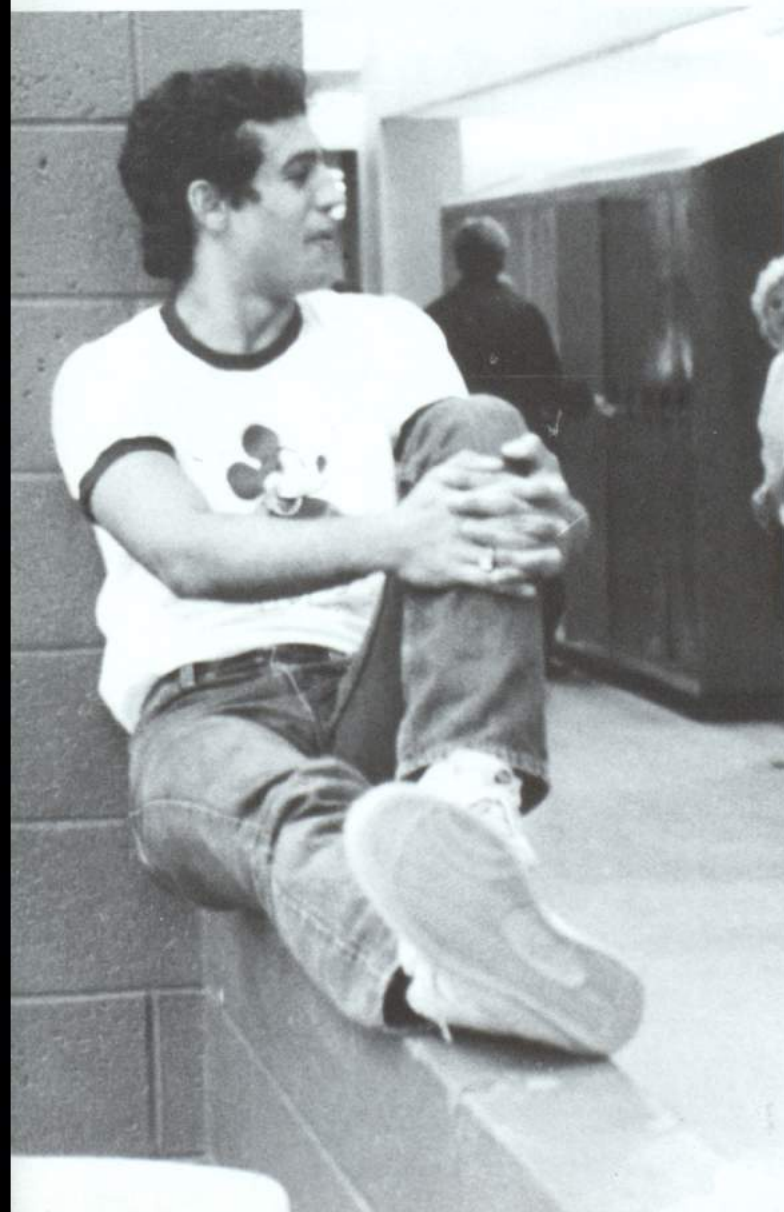

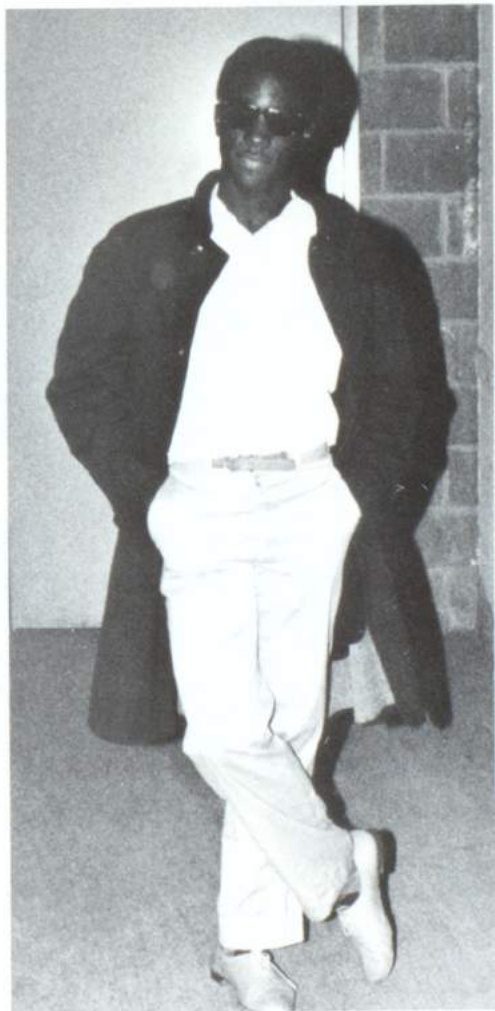

NASA Shuttle Disaster Shocks the Nation

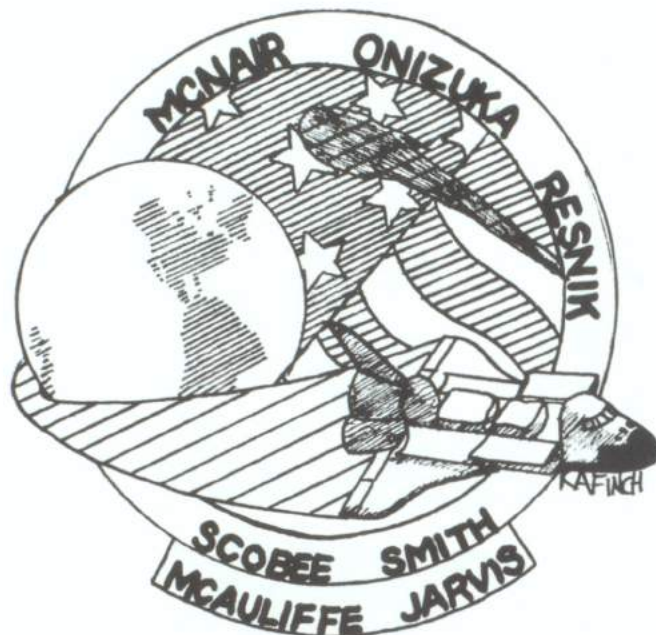
Tragedy struck the nation when six of its astronauts and teacher, Christa McAuliffe died in a shocking shuttle explosion.

Seventy-four seconds after lift-off, the spaceship Challenger exploded. Little explanation was offered for the worst space disaster in NASA history. After repeated slow-motion film research, it was believed that a flame or other abnormality on one of the rocket boosters, ignited the leading fuel tank.

The two women and five men: Christa McAuliffe, Francis R. Scobee, Micheal S. Smith, Judith Resnik, Ronald E. McNair, Ellison S. Onizuka and Gregory B. Jarvis died brave heroes, as the world looked on along with the astronauts' families. Afterwards a memorial was held in which President Reagan bid farewell to the space shuttle crew.

Christa McAuliffe, the school teacher, was chosen from more than 7,000 applicants for the space mission. She felt the voyage into space was an important step, especially in education.

Despite the dreadful accident and unanswered questions, the shuttle program is determined to continue on.



AIDS: A Spreading Disease That Spreads Fear Across the U.S.

Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome is a communicable disease that has been a growing concern among our nation. Americans' biggest fear of this disease is its spread by blood transfusions. A new blood test has been developed to test whether the person is a carrier of the virus. Some want to make this test mandatory to make the control of the disease easier. Others argue that it is an invasion of privacy and believe it can cause discrimination. Victims of AIDS have been rejected or removed from jobs and apartments. Children who have contracted the deadly disease or carry the virus have been kept out of school or are isolated from the rest of the classmates. The Pentagon decided to rest all personnel and recruits for signs of AIDS in order to reject them. So far a cure for this disease has not been found.

Disasters That Shook the World

Mexican Earthquake

In September, an earthquake, measuring 8.2 on the Richter scale, hit Mexico City. On the following day, an aftershock measuring 7.5 caused further destruction. Hundreds of buildings collapsed and more than 5,000 people were killed.

Hurricanes

A family of hurricanes plagued the United States in '85. First hurricane Bob struck followed by Danny and Elena. Next hurricane Gloria threatened the Northeastern coast as thousands fled from their coastal homes. Fortunately, Gloria didn't prove as damaging as expected. Gloria was then followed by hurricanes Juan and Kate. Altogether these hurricanes caused 5 billion dollars worth of damage and took the lives of 36 people.

Plane Crashes

Air travel wasn't the safest in 1985 as the year was marred by crashes around the world that killed more than 1,400 people. Plane crashes included a Delta Air Lines Lockheed L-1011 that crashed at Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport on August 2, killing 136 people and a Japanese Boeing 747 Japan Air Line that struck a mountain killing 520 passengers. Another aviation disaster occurred on June 23 with the mysterious crash of a Boeing 747, flown by Air India off the coast of Ireland killing 329 passengers and crew.



AROUND THE WORLD

Geneva Summit USA vs. USSR

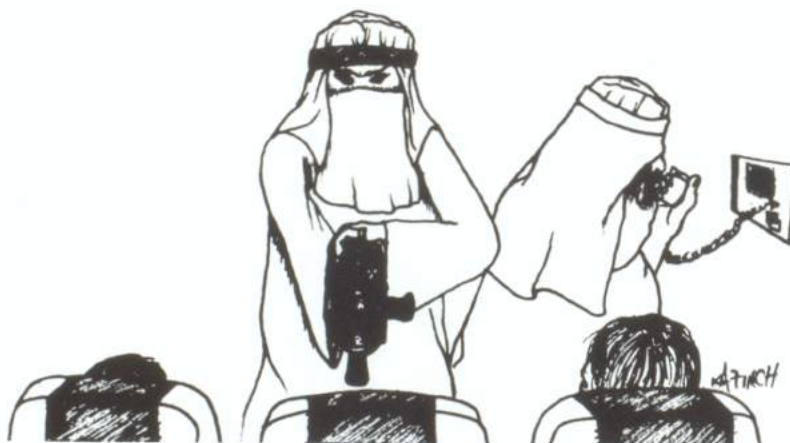
This year opened with some encouraging signs of arms control as the US and the Soviet Union met in November for a summit meeting in Geneva. A new era began in the Kremlin as a new leader, Mikhail Gorbachev, stepped into the scene. When Reagan and Gorbachev met, there seemed to be an understanding between them which signaled more favorable relations with the Russians. At the meeting, the Soviets took the initiative by proposing a 50% reduction in US and Soviet long range and short range nuclear weapons. The US "Star Wars" research is still a critical issue on which the sides cannot agree, but the Geneva Summit meetings did open a communication line as both countries agreed to meet again in 1986 and 1987.

Terrorism Hits Close to Home

Americans suffered tense times this year when terrorists attacked the world. The most violent hijacking was the TWA airline takeover that occurred on June 14. When the Palestinians seized the Egyptian airline 60 were killed. Rescue forces appeared on the scene and those that survived were welcomed home after 17 days of captivity. Another terrorist nightmare happened when 4 PLO men seized the Italian ship the Achilles Laurel on October 7. Egypt eventually became a mediator and two days after the seizure the gunmen turned themselves in in exchange for a safe passage out of Egypt; but not before murdering the crippled Leon Klinghoffer. The plane carrying the terrorists was intercepted by the U.S. Navy and the Italians tried them for murder and kidnapping. The PLO leader in charge of the whole ordeal was allowed to leave Italy despite U.S. objection.

Aid to Africa

Music and charity went hand and hand this year. Top music artists joined their voices on July 13, in Philadelphia, to raise money for the African famine relief fund. This extravaganza, known as Live Aid raised over \$70.5 billion dollars for Africa and included such stars as, Phil Collins, Paul McCartney, Bruce Springsteen, Madonna, Led Zeppelin, and others. Willie Nelson, was the organizer of Farm Aid which raised money to help the American farmers. A song "Sun City" was recorded by such artists as Bruce Springsteen, Miles Davis and Bob Dylan, to protest against South African Apartheid. Dionne Warwick and friends sang "That's What Friends Are For" to give its profits towards the cure for Aids. With the help and support of these fine artists donations of over 137 million dollars were collected for these and other causes.

On January 24th a state of emergency was called in the city of Binghamton for breaks and leaks in the pipes of the water system. Broome County Health Commissioner ordered everyone drinking or cooking with city water to boil it. It was the most severe water emergency in the history of Binghamton and was estimated to cost the city more than \$309,000. Businesses and schools were ordered closed until underground water pipes could start to be repaired. After a few days the water was declared safe again and life resumed to normal activity.

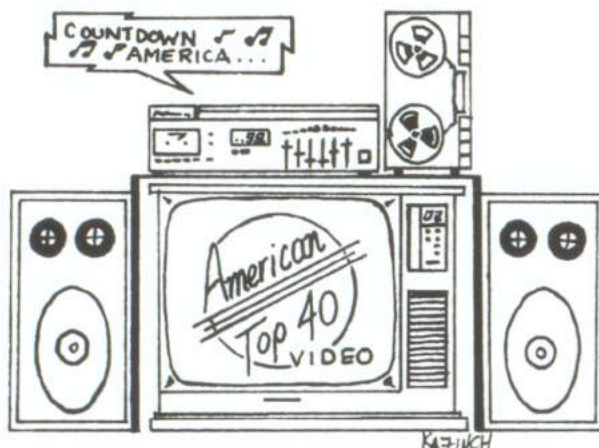

Titanic

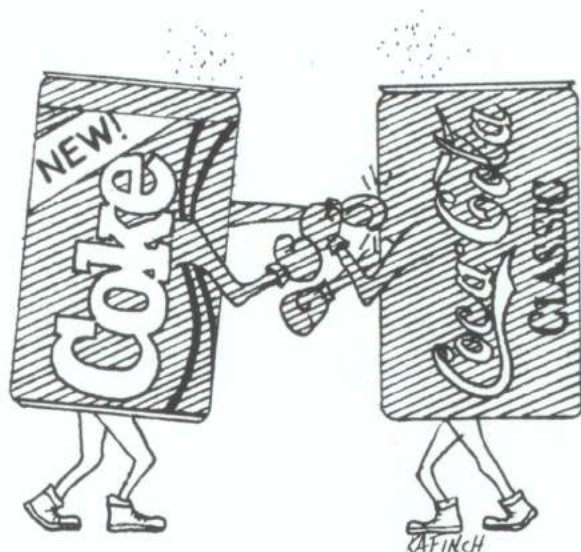
