

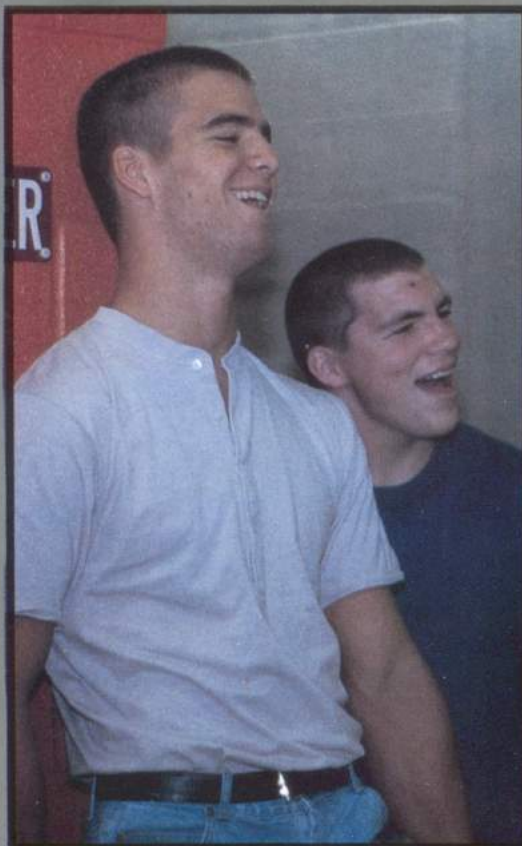

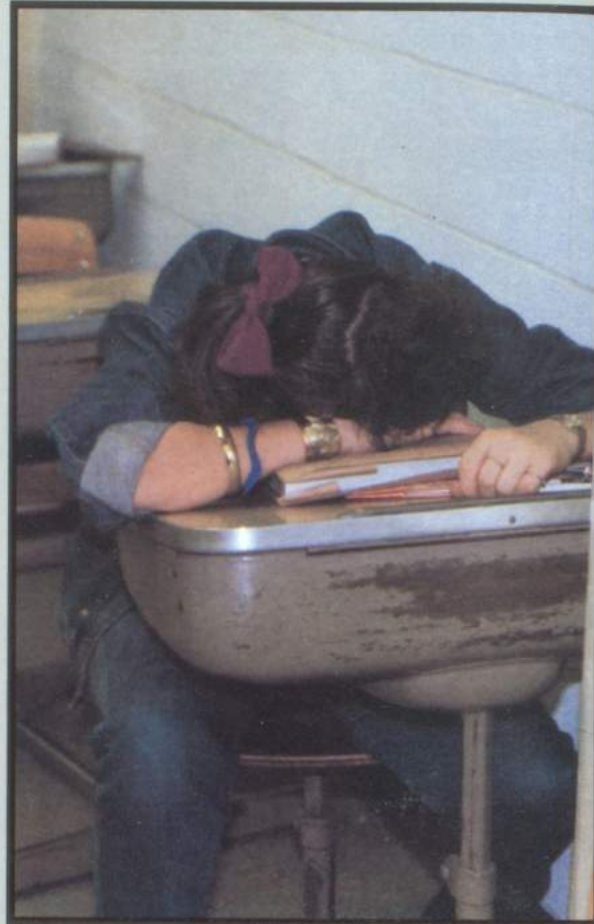
Time passes quickly. Things come and go before you know it; and though it may not always seem so, high school is one of those times.

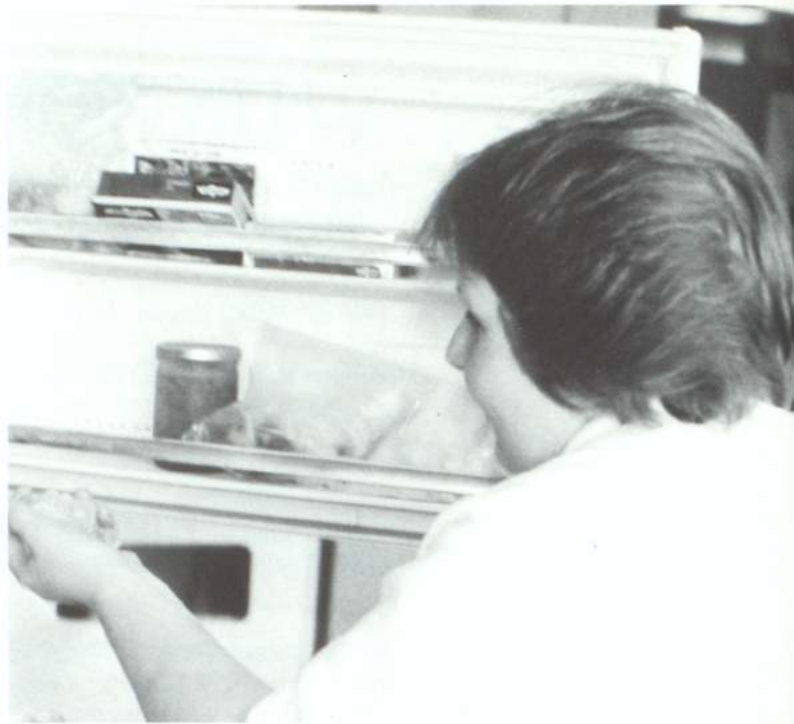

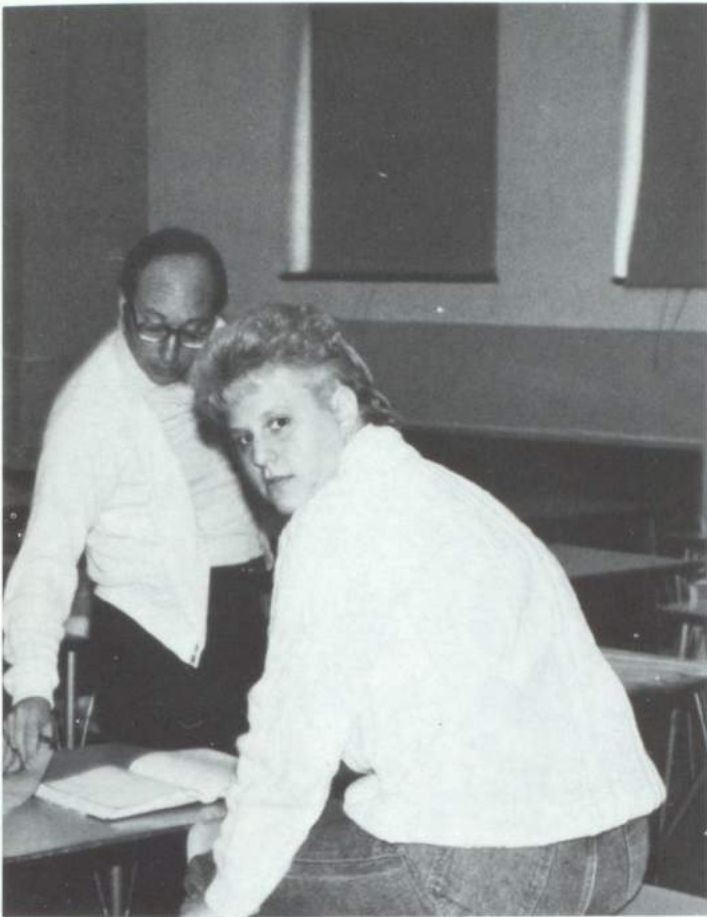

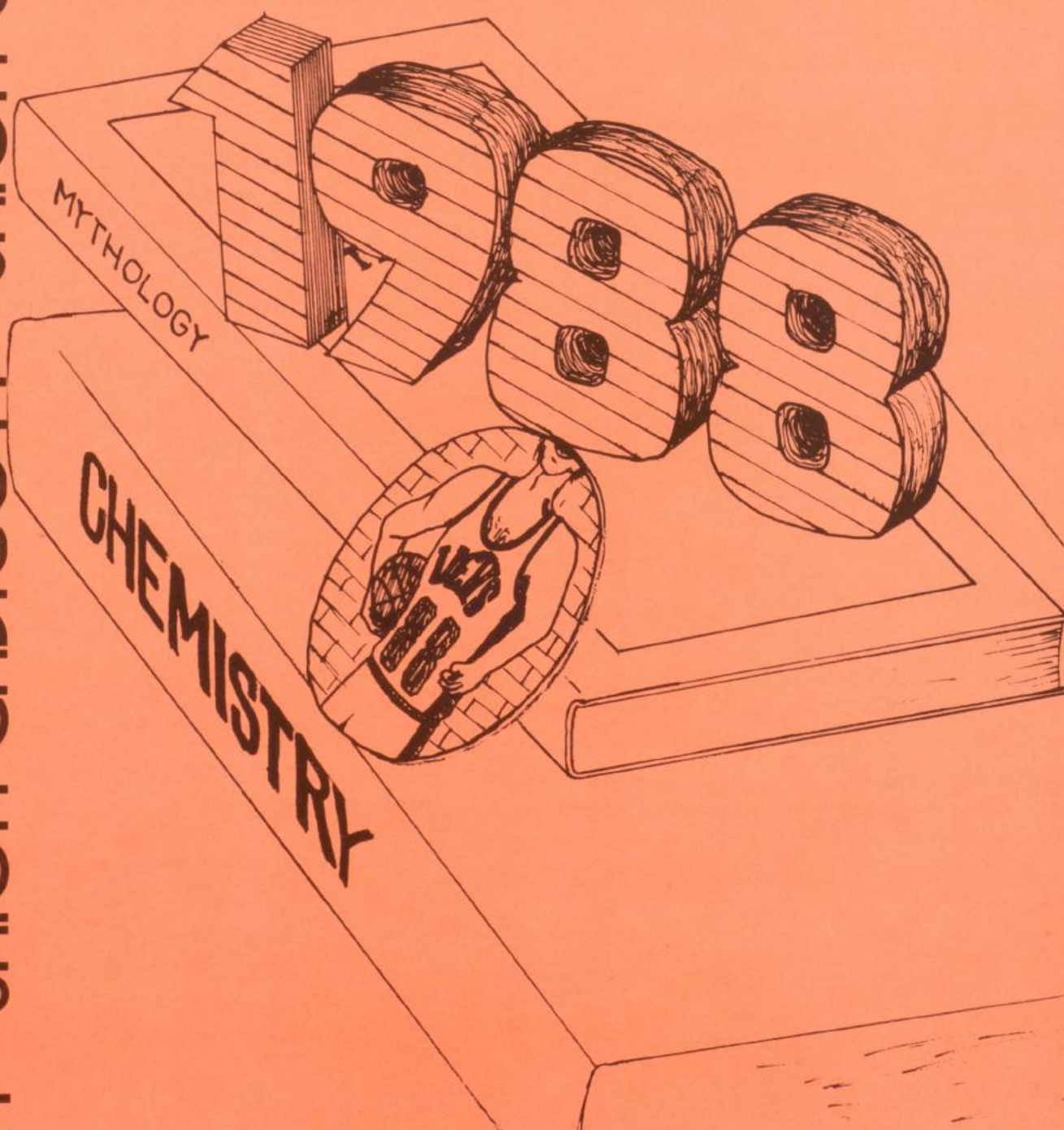

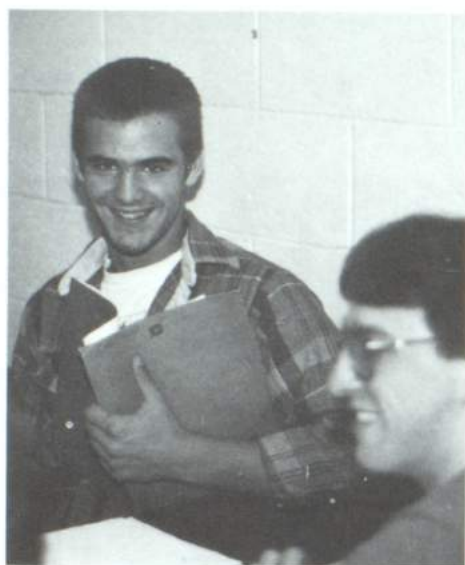
We would also like to thank Mrs. Rae Jean James, our class advisor. Without her help and efforts, many of our projects wouldn't have been successful.

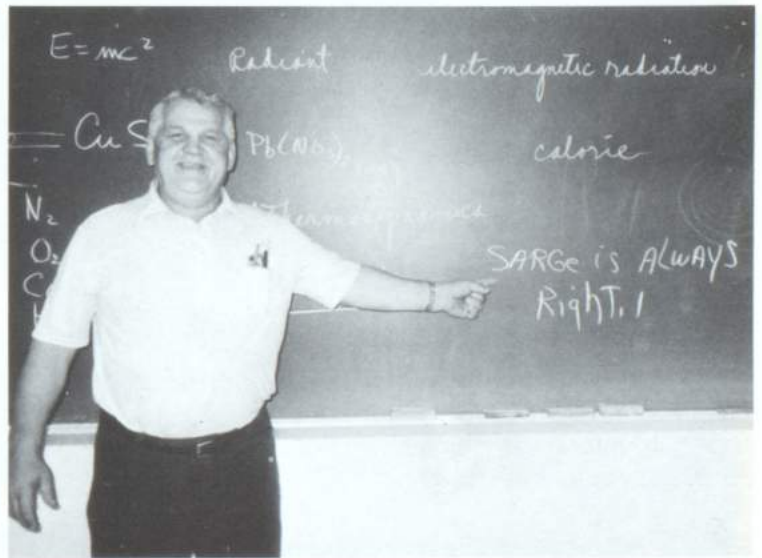

THE YEARBOOK

Most people have no idea of the kind of work that's involved in putting the yearbook together. Every year approximately 50 students sign up to work and by the end of the year, there are only about a dozen left who are still working.

The yearbook staff consists of staff members, section editors, and photographers. We start out the year by selling advertisements to various businesses in the area.

Staff members have to go door to door to sell ads, then layouts must be drawn up for each page. All of this has to be done by October. Once the ads are taken care of, the section editors can start on their sections.

Each section editor has approximately 40 pages assigned to them. The following is a step-by-step account of what goes into each and every page:

1. Come up with design for the page
2. Draw the dominant photo.
3. Draw surrounding photos and copy.
4. Come up with a catchy title (if possible) and label it on the layout.
5. Write copy and captions for the photo.
6. Type up captions and copy on copy sheets.
7. Pick out pictures to be used.
8. Crop pictures and label them with job stickers.
9. Have Editor-in-Chief proofread the page.
10. Have the page proofread and signed by the advisor.

It takes us from September until March, which is when we have our final deadline, to finish the 280 pages of the book.

Although putting the yearbook together is a lot of hard work, we also have a lot of fun, such as at a nightly work sessions with sheet pizza and a bottle of soda (preferably Coke) to keep us awake.

Maybe now when you flip through the pages in this book, you won't just see what's in the pictures, you'll see what's behind them as well.

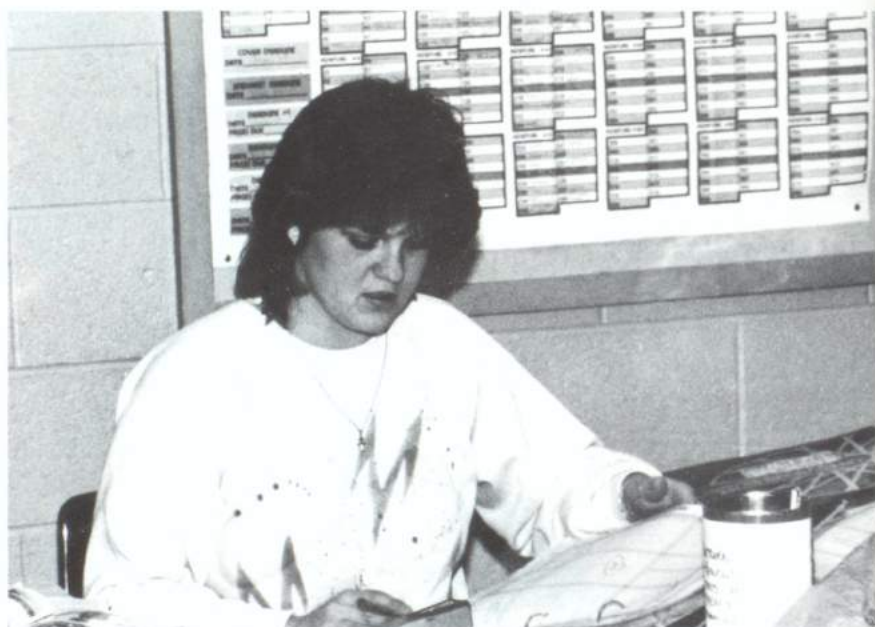

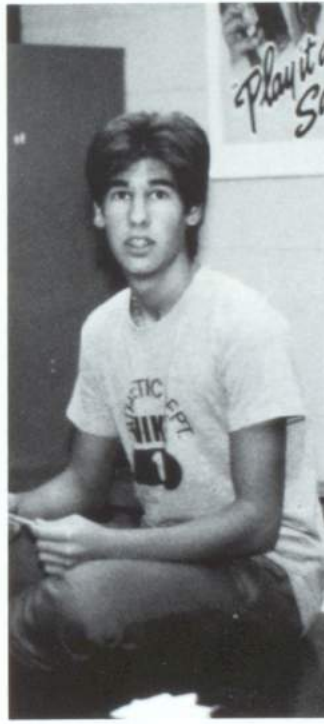

Co-operative Office Skills Program

This program has the advantage of coordinating theory and practice for the benefit of the student, school, and employer. It is a plan whereby business students may receive Regents credit for actual work experience in approved jobs that are related to a course in which they are enrolled. Students who maintain satisfactory grades and earn a satisfactory job performance rating by their employer and supervising teacher may receive credit. One half unit is earned for working each 150 hours up to a maximum of two credits per year for 600 or more hours. The group meets periodically with the advisor, Mr. Dupkanick in school. Once, near the beginning of each school year, the co-ops and their parents/guardians meet with business teachers and school personnel to have an orientation meeting.

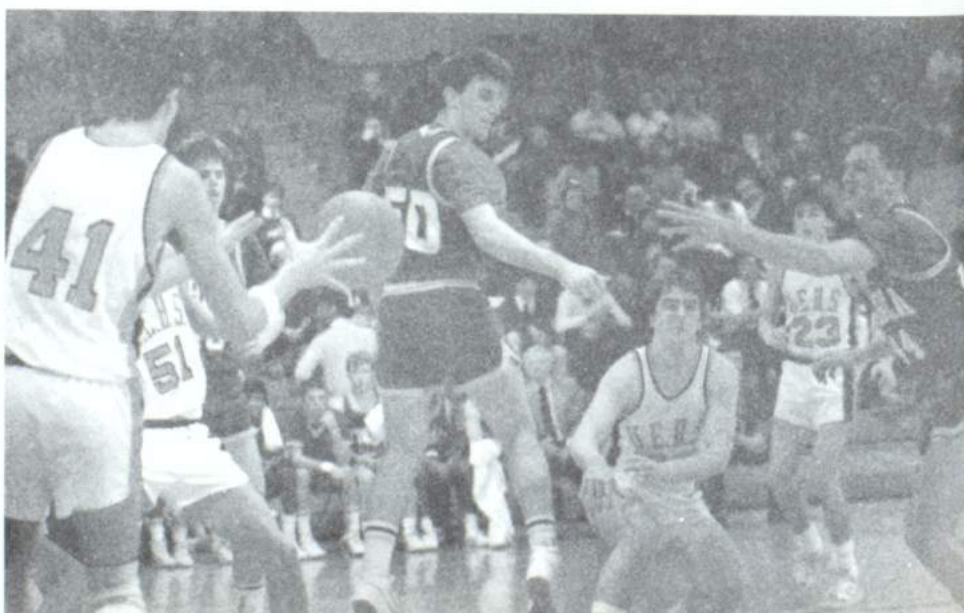

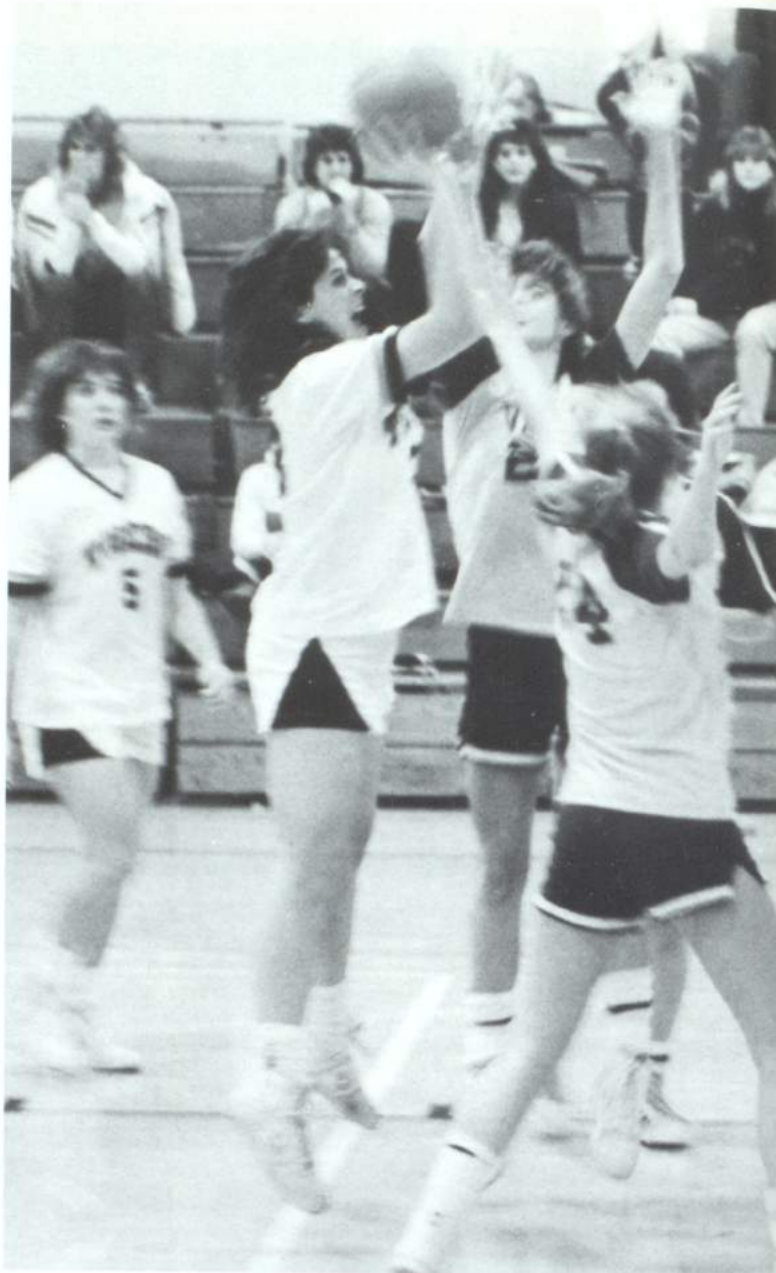
CLASSY CAGERS

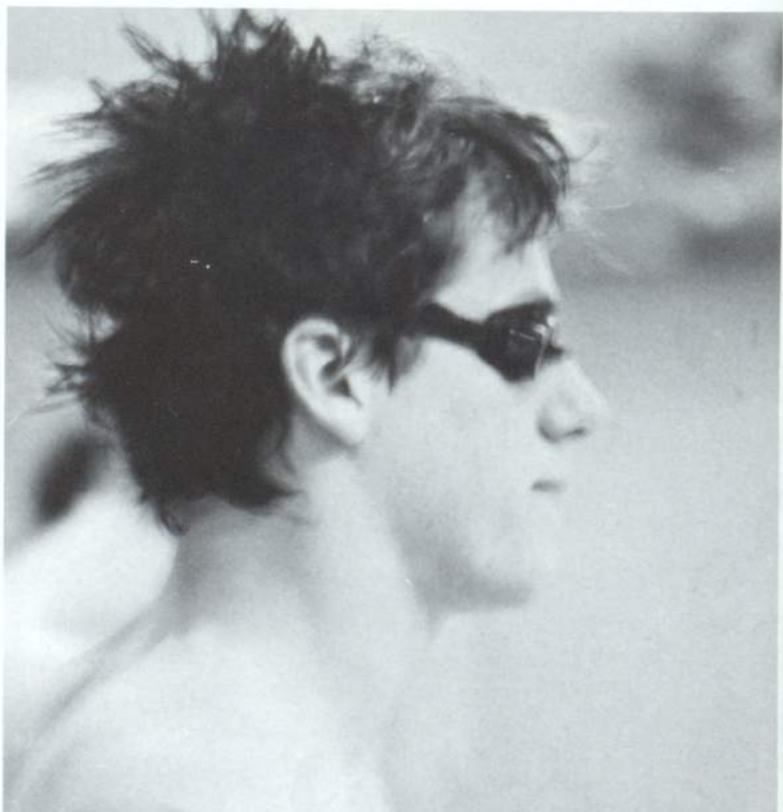


STAC CHAMPS!

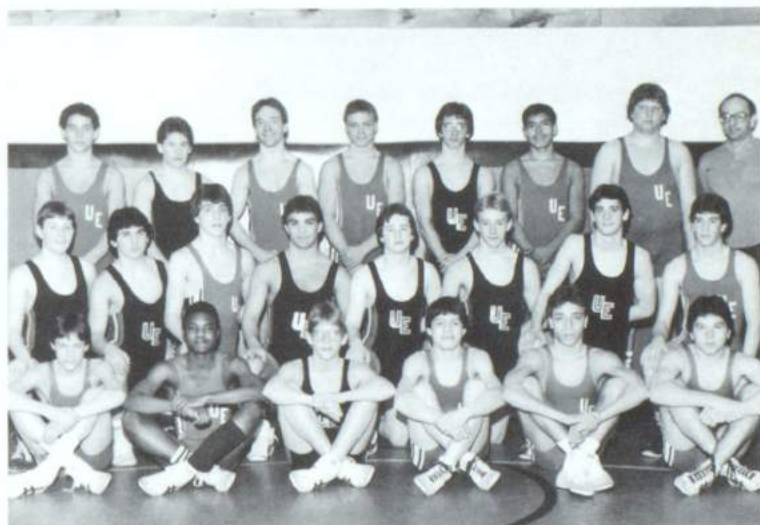




JUNIOR GRAPPLERS

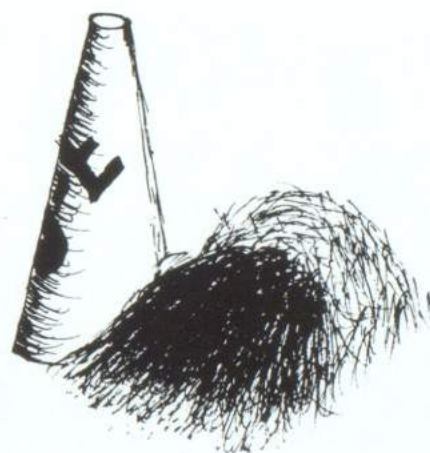

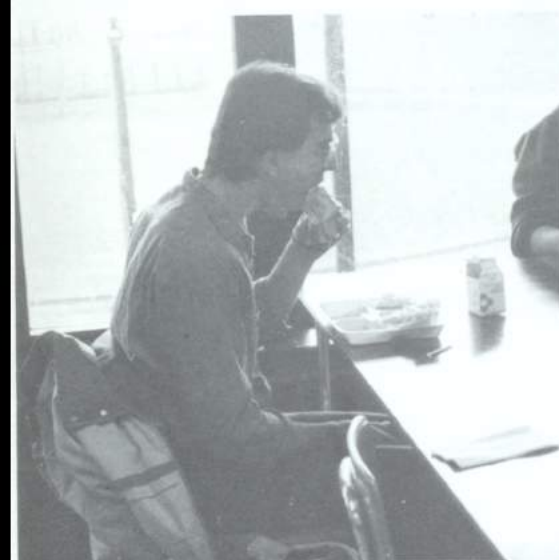
